## 2007 U.S. OPEN CUP QUARTERFINALS: REVOLUTION VS. CITY ISLANDERS

### REVS' OPEN CUP HISTORY

The Revolution is 6-6-2 all-time in U.S. Open Cup play, reaching the final of the event in 2001 ... the Revs have participated in the tournament eight times, including this season, since the team's inception: 1997, 2000, 2001, and 2003-07 ... the team's best-ever showing was a runner-up finish in 2001, falling to the Los Angeles Galaxy, 2-1, in stoppage time in the final at Titan Stadium in Fullerton, Calif.

### REVS MAKE FOURTH QUARTERFINAL APPEARANCE

The Revolution is making its fourth appearance in the quarterfinals of the U.S. Open Cup ... the Revs also made it to the round of eight in 2001, 2003 and 2006 ... only once before has New England moved past the quarterfinals – in 2001 when they went all the way to the championship game.

### SEMIFINAL LOCATIONS SET

Should the Revs advance past Harrisburg and move into the semifinals of the U.S. Open Cup, New England won the right to host the game ... the game would be played at **Veterans Stadium in New Britain, Conn.**, and the date would depend on the opponent ... should the Revs move on to face the Carolina RailHawks (USL-1), the game would be played at **7 p.m. on Tuesday, Sept. 4** ... should the Revs advance and face the Richmond Kickers (USL-2), the game would be at **7 p.m. on Wednesday, Sept. 5**.

### SUNDAY'S GAME SOLD OUT

On Thursday, Aug. 2, the Revs announced that Sunday's match against Los Angeles had sold out ... no further tickets will be available for sale for the highly-anticipated match-up ... the soccer capacity was expanded to 32,000 for the match, and will include the entire lower bowl of the Gillette Stadium, as well as the East Fidelity Investments Clubhouse.

### CHARITY BENEFITS FROM SUNDAY'S GAME

The **New England Revolution Charitable Foundation** raised **\$13,745.64** on the 22 online auctions for the pregame player escorts for Sunday's game ... the escort spot for **David Beckham** raised \$3,050.01, while **Landon Donovan's** auction raised \$925.50 ... **Jay Heaps** was the Revs player with the highest bid, going for \$717.77 ... **Andy Dorman** went for \$589.99, while **Taylor Twellman** and **Wells Thompson** each went for \$510 ... the rest of the Revs went for bids between \$381.88 and \$466 ... the nine other Galaxy escorts fetched winning bids between \$382.50 and \$610.

### TIME/TV CHANGE FOR AUGUST 16 AT COLORADO

The kickoff time for the Revs' game at Colorado on Thursday, Aug. 16, has been pushed up one hour and the game will now start at 9 p.m. ET (7 p.m. MT) ... additionally, Fox Sports New England will televise the game live ... ESPN2 had originally be scheduled to televise the game live at 10 p.m. ET.

### KEEPING THEIR DISTANCE

After last weekend's games, the Revs have built a four-point lead in the Eastern Conference ... with 33 points in 19 games, the Revolution is four points ahead of Kansas City, which has 29 points in 19 games ... however, while the Revs have earned a bit of breathing room at the top of the table, the rest of the Eastern Conference is still a packed bunch: three points separate second place and fifth place ... D.C. and New York are tied for third with 27 points, and Columbus is fifth with 26 points.

### MLS' TOP TEAM STATISTICALLY

Despite the team's loss to D.C. on Sunday, the Revs are still MLS' top team in several important categories ... with a 9-4-6 overall record and 33 points, the Revs have a .632 winning percentage ... New England boasts the league's top scoring average (1.74 goals per game) and scoring total (33 goals) ... the Revs have the fewest losses in the league this season – one fewer than any team – and have taken points in 15 of 19 games.

### BUSY STRETCH

The Revolution has now entered into its toughest and busiest stretch of the season, as the team is playing **eight games in four weeks** ... this stretch of the Revs' schedule sees them play seven MLS games and a U.S. Open Cup quarterfinal match before enjoying a bye week in their schedule during Labor Day weekend ... the upcoming schedule is as follows: Aug. 8 vs. Harrisburg City Islanders in the U.S. Open Cup quarterfinals, Aug. 12 vs. Los Angeles, Aug. 16 at Colorado, Aug. 19 at Kansas City and Aug. 25 vs. New York ... the Revs started the stretch in winning fashion, going 2-0 so far in this run (2-1 win at Real Salt Lake on July 28 and a 2-0 victory over Kansas City at home on Aug. 2), but then suffered a 3-0 loss to United on Aug. 5.

### TORRID SCORING

The Revs sit atop MLS' leaders in team scoring average, netting 1.74 goals per game this season ... the team has scored 33 goals in 19 games ... last season, the Revs scored 39 goals in 32 games, for a 1.22 goals per game mark ... New England leads MLS in three-goal games this season with seven, one more than Kansas City (6) and

two more than Houston and New York, who are tied for third with five three-goal games ... in total, the Revs have posted 10 multiple-goal games – more than half of their games this season.

### HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE

New England has improved its home record to 4-2-4 on the season with 22 goals scored (2.20 goals per game) ... the Revs have scored three or more goals in six of their 10 home games ... New England's 2.20 goals per home game is MLS' second-best home scoring average, behind D.C. United (2.63).

### GILLETTE STADIUM IS REVS' HOME "TURF"

The Revs have felt quite at home this season on the FieldTurf Monofilament System installed at Gillette Stadium last November, compiling a 4-1-2 record on the artificial surface ... although the Revolution has played 10 home games, three were played on a natural grass surface that was laid for several international games played between May 26 and July 16, including the CONCACAF Gold Cup ... the team's results on the different surfaces at Gillette Stadium is remarkable, going 4-1-2 and out-scoring opponents 16-7 on the FieldTurf, while posting a 0-1-2 mark with a 6-7 goal deficit on the temporary grass ... overall this season, the Revs are 5-1-2 in games played on artificial surfaces.

### NOONAN!

Pat Noonan has found the prime playing form that earned him MLS All-Star status and a place on the U.S. National Team ... he has scored goals in three of the last four games, and now has five goals on the season – all coming in the last nine games ... overall this season, Noonan has five goals and four assists, his best totals since 2005 ... Noonan missed time this season recovering from preseason sports hernia surgery, after missing all but 14 games in 2006 with myriad injuries ... Noonan now has 35 career goals with the Revs, and 29 assists.

### TERRIBLE TWOSOME

Dating back to their days as childhood friends who would play in each other's backyards, **Taylor Twellman** and **Pat Noonan** have always had a great relationship on the field ... after finally being reunited in a full-time capacity this season after Noonan struggled to regain his form from various injuries in 2006 and early 2007, the twosome has once again emerged as MLS' most lethal scoring duo ... in the last four games, the pair has combined for four goals and four assists – all on each other's goals ... three of Noonan's four assists have come on Twellman goals this year, and all three of Twellman's assists have come on Noonan's last three goals ... in their four years together in New England, they have produced the following:

- 92 goals (57 by Twellman, 35 by Noonan)
- 49 assists (20 by Twellman, 29 by Noonan)
- 13 of Noonan's 29 assists have come on Twellman goals
- five of Twellman's 26 career assists have come on Noonan strikes

### TWELLMAN'S TOUCH

**Taylor Twellman** scored his team-leading eighth goal of the season on July 22 against Houston, pushing his year-to-date mark to eight goals ... he is currently fourth in MLS this season in scoring, even though he missed three games while away on U.S. National Team duty ... his goal against Houston on July 22 also moved Twellman into sole possession of sixth place on the MLS career scoring chart (83 goals), and is now just five goals back of fifth place (Roy Lassiter, 88 goals).

### ROAD WARRIORS

The road has also become a second home for New England ... the Revs have MLS' best road record this season, registering a 5-2-2 mark away from home for a .633 winning percentage ... New England played six of its first eight games on the road, going 3-1-2 in that stretch to explode out of the gates this season, and is now 2-0-0 in its last two road matches after a loss at Chivas USA on June 30.

### RALSTON OWNS A HANDFUL OF MLS RECORDS

With his assist on Andy Dorman's game-winning goal at New York on July 14, **Steve Ralston** claimed the MLS career assist record as his own, his fifth MLS career record ... with the helper, he collected his record 115<sup>th</sup> career assist, putting him past former Tampa Bay teammate Carlos Valderrama, who had 114 in his career ... Ralston also moved into a tie with Valderrama for first place on the MLS career list for game-winning assists, as both players now have 33 ... Ralston also owns the MLS career records for appearances, starts and minutes.

### RALSTON'S ROLLING THIS SEASON, TOO

Despite missing two Revs games while with Team USA, **Steve Ralston** is also atop the MLS assists leader board with nine in 16 games, two assists ahead of Columbus' Guillermo Barros Schelotto, who has seven ... Ralston now has 116 career assists, and his nine assists marks his highest season total since he recorded a career-high 19 in 2002 in his first season with the Revs.

## 2007 U.S. OPEN CUP QUARTERFINALS: REVOLUTION VS. CITY ISLANDERS

### REIS' PIECES

Goalkeeper **Matt Reis** recorded his seventh shutout of the season on Aug. 2, when he made five saves on his way to clean sheet against the high-powered Kansas City attack ... his shutout lifted him into a tie for first place in the league in shutouts this season, matching Houston's Pat Onstad's seven shutouts ... since the 2005 season, Reis has recorded more shutouts - 27 - than any other goalkeeper in MLS ... Reis has collected his seven shutouts in 19 games, and is now just three shutouts shy of matching his single-season best - 10 - which he's twice accomplished in 32-game seasons (2005 & 2006).

### REIS IS REVS' MINUTE MAN

Goalkeeper **Matt Reis** has started and played 90 minutes (and all extra-time sessions) in each of the Revs' last 67 MLS games overall, including playoff matches ... since returning from a one-game red card suspension on Sept. 3, 2005, Reis has started each of the Revs' last 67 matches - including eight playoff games - to push his consecutive-minutes-played mark **6,120 minutes**.

### DORMAN'S DYNAMITE

**Andy Dorman** has scored more goals in the first half of this season than he did in the Revs' full 32-game schedule last year ... with his seventh goal of the year - scored at New York on July 14 - Dorman pushed his season total to seven, a single-season best for the England product ... Dorman's previous single-season best was six, which he recorded in 32 games last year ... between June 23 and July 14 (four games), Dorman scored four of the team's five total goals ... Dorman now has 17 goals in his four-year Revolution career, ninth on the club's record books ... entering this weekend's MLS action, he's tied for fifth in the league in goal scoring this year.

### DORMAN TOP MIDFIELDER

**Andy Dorman's** seven goals is the highest scoring total of any of MLS' midfielders this season ... of all the players tied or ahead of him on the goal scoring chart, Dorman is the only midfielder among those six players.

### CRISTMAN TOPS '07 ROOKIE POOL

With outstanding play in the first half of the season, forward **Adam Cristman** solidified his position as the league's top rookie so far in 2007 ... 19 games into the season, Cristman leads all MLS rookies in goals (4) and assists (4) ... he has started 11 games and has appeared in 18 contests ... Cristman was a fourth-round draft pick - 48th overall - in the 2007 MLS SuperDraft ... he leads other top rookie scorers Maurice Edu (top overall selection by Toronto FC; three goals, one assist), Michael Harrington (third overall by Kansas City; three goals, three assists) and Dane Richards (19th overall by New York; one goal, three assists) ... all statistics as of Monday, Aug. 6.

### COMING OUT ON FIRE

The Revolution have scored a league-best 17 first-half goals this season ... the Revs have scored seven goals in the first 15 minutes of games this season (more than any other MLS team), and have added four in the 16-30 minute interval, and six in the 31-45 minute interval.

### HOLDING ON TO LEADS

Since the start of the 2005 season, New England is undefeated when leading at halftime ... the Revs have registered a 26-0-5 mark when ahead at the intermission since opening day of 2005.

### ROOKIES GETTING TIME

For the second time this season - and just the second time in Revs head coach Steve Nicol's tenure in New England - the Revolution started three rookies in a game on Saturday, June 30 at Chivas USA ... with injuries and international call-ups, **Adam Cristman**, **Wells Thompson** and **Gary Flood** all got the nod in the starting 11 ... the trio also started the season opener at Chicago on April 7 ... so far this season, a total of four rookies have touched the field as **Bryan Byrne** also made his MLS debut earlier this season.

### DOING THE DOUBLE

Four times this season a Revolution player has struck for multiple goals in a game ... **Taylor Twellman** has scored two goals twice this season (against Toronto FC on April 14 and at Los Angeles on May 12) ... **Adam Cristman** became the first Revs rookie to hit for a pair - since Pat Noonan in 2005 - when he scored twice against Columbus on June 16 ... the most recent player to score twice in a game was **Andy Dorman**, who recorded his first-career multiple-goal game against Toronto on June 23.

### SHALRIE SHOOTS

**Shalrie Joseph** has already passed his 2006 season total in goals scored with four ... Joseph's single-season best total is six goals, which he scored in 2005.

### PENALTY PERFECTION

**Shalrie Joseph** is now 3-for-3 from the penalty spot this season after converting his attempt on July 22 against Houston ... the Revs' first-choice PK taker, Joseph is now a perfect 6-for-6 from the penalty spot in regular-season MLS games in his career since entering the league in 2003 and is tied for the Revs' all-time club lead in the category with Joe-Max Moore.

### LARENTOW-ROCKET

**Jeff Larentowicz's** third career goal is going to be a memorable one for the third-year defensive midfielder ... after the Revs earned a free kick 24 yards out against Real Salt Lake on July 28, Larentowicz surprisingly called off Revs regular free-kick specialist Steve Ralston and stepped up for the long-range shot ... his rocket of a free kick found a sliver of space between the RSL wall and Shalrie Joseph, and Larentowicz scored the eventual game-winning goal ... his goal was nominated for Sierra Mist Goal of the Week at MLSnet.com.

### DIAPER DANDIES

The Revs' 2007 draft class of nine players - which included six players from the SuperDraft and three additional players from the Supplemental Draft - is the **largest group of drafted first-year players** in team history ... eight of those players are currently under contract to play for the Revs.

### RECORD-BREAKING RALSTON

Steve Ralston now holds all of MLS' longevity records, in addition to his career assist record ... Ralston leads the 12-year-old league in minutes played (29,078), games started (326) and appearances (328).

### AGE-OLD RALLY

As MLS's leader in career minutes played and an "MLS Original," **Steve Ralston** has played 4,872 minutes - equivalent to approximately 54 full games - more than the next active player on the list (Cobi Jones, LA; 24,206 minutes).

### FRANCHINO DONE FOR THE YEAR

On Tuesday, June 19, veteran midfielder/defender **Joe Franchino** was granted a "Season-Ending Injury" by Major League Soccer ... he sustained a longitudinal tear of the peroneal tendon in his right ankle and underwent reconstructive surgery on Monday, July 2 ... George Theodore, M.D., performed the surgery at Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston ... Franchino's expected recovery and rehabilitation period is six months ... Franchino made just three first-team appearances and three reserve division appearances for the team this season while battling the effects of the injury.

### REVS REPRESENTED WELL AT ALL-STAR GAME

A trio of Revolution players and almost the entire Revs technical staff represented the club at the 2007 MLS All-Star game in Commerce City, Colo., on Thursday, July 19 ... goalkeeper **Matt Reis**, defender **Michael Parkhurst** and midfielder **Shalrie Joseph** were all voted to the 18-man roster and helped the MLS All-Stars to a 2-0 victory against Scottish giant Celtic FC, ... Revs head coach **Steve Nicol** led the MLS All-Stars, and was joined on the bench by New England goalkeepers coach **Gwynne Williams**, as well as Houston assistant coach John Spencer ... other members of the Revs' staff - Director of Soccer **Mike Burns**, head athletic trainer **Wayne Penniman** and equipment manager **Brian Banfill** - were also included on the gameday staff for the MLS All-Stars ... **Taylor Twellman** and **Steve Ralston** were also named 2007 MLS All-Stars, but were added to the inactive roster.

### WAKE EFFECT
