NEW ENGLAND VS. DALLAS SERIES INFORMATION

- This is the first-ever meeting between the two teams in non-MLS regular-season action ... New England and Dallas have never met in either the MLS Cup Playoffs or in the U.S. Open Cup
- The Revolution leads overall series between the two teams, 19-9-1, and is 7-2-0 against the Hoops since the 2004 season
- New England's 19 victories against Dallas is tied for the club's second-highest win total against MLS teams, one more than its 17 against D.C. United ... the Revs have won 23 games against New York
- Since 2002 under head coach Steve Nicol, the Revs are 11-3-0 against Dallas
- In the last 16 meetings against Dallas, the Revolution is 13-3-0
- The Revolution is 10-4-1 in games played in Dallas and 2-1-0 in games against Dallas at Pizza Hut Park ... New England owns an 9-5-0 record at home against Dallas and is 5-1-0 at Gillette Stadium
- New England has not lost at home against Dallas since 2003
- The Revolution was the first visiting team to earn a victory at Pizza Hut Park, taking a 2-1 win on Aug. 13, 2005
- The Revs have played two previous cup finals at Pizza Hut park, losing both MLS Cup 2005 and MLS Cup 2006 at the new soccer stadium ... in 2005, the Revs lost to Los Angeles, 1-0, in overtime, while the Houston Dynamo topped New England, 4-3 in penalty kicks after a 1-1 draw in MLS Cup 2006
- New England won six of the team's first seven meetings (1996-97), before Dallas went 5-1-1 in the next three-and-a-half seasons (1998-2001)

PLAYER NOTES VS. DALLAS

- Taylor Twellman** leads the Revs with career goals (14) against FC Dallas, a figure that marks his highest total against any MLS team ... seven of his goals have been game-winners ... he scored the game's only goal in the teams' first meeting of the season, April 29 at Pizza Hut Park
- Pat Noonan** had a pair of goals in the teams' last meeting on Sept. 15, bringing his career totals against Dallas to four goals and four assists in eight games
- Steve Ralston** leads New England in career assists (7) against Dallas, including the game-winning assist on Twellman's goal on April 29 this season in Frisco
- Taylor Twellman** scored a hat trick against FCD on July 16, 2005 at Gillette Stadium, scoring all three goals in the 3-2 victory ... his second goal - and game-tying strike - came in the 90th minute, while his game-winning third goal came in the 92nd minute.
- Matt Reis** has registered a 1.33 goals against average against Dallas and a career 7-3-3 record, which includes five shutouts.

2007 LAMAR HUNT U.S. OPEN CUP FINAL: NEW ENGLAND REVOLUTION AT FC DALLAS

OPEN CUP FINALISTS

The Revolution are competing in just their second-ever U.S. Open Cup final ... in 2001, the Revs advanced to the championship game, but fell to the Los Angeles Galaxy, 2-1 in overtime, in Fullerton, Calif. ... that season, New England played its first four matches of the Open Cup at the old Foxboro Stadium, defeating the Mid-Michigan Bucks (PDL), 7-1; the Charleston Battery (A-League), 2-1; Columbus Crew (MLS), 2-1; and D.C. United (MLS), 2-0, on the way to the final.

REVS' OPEN CUP HISTORY

The Revolution is 8-6-2 all-time in U.S. Open Cup play, reaching the final of the event in 2001 ... the Revs have participated in the tournament eight times, including this season, since the team's inception: 1997, 2000, 2001, and 2003-07.

HOW WE GOT HERE

SEMIFINALS: Revs 2, Carolina RailHawks 1 (AET)

Behind **Pat Noonan's** goal three minutes into extra time of their semifinal match against the Carolina RailHawks, the New England Revolution advanced to the finals of the 2007 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup ... Noonan factored in on both Revs goals in their 2-1 semifinal victory over the Carolina RailHawks (USL-1) on Sept. 4 in New Britain, Conn., scoring in extra time and assisting on **Jeff Larentowicz's** low diving game-tying tally in first-half stoppage time ... **Anthony Maher** put the visitors up 1-0 in the sixth minute, volleying in a **Jonny Steele** pass.

QUARTERFINALS: Revs 2, Harrisburg City Islanders 1

Andy Dorman and **Taylor Twellman** scored in the fourth and 17th minutes as the Revs earned a 2-1 victory over the USL-2 Harrisburg City Islanders at Gillette Stadium on Aug. 8 ... Dorman converted a Joseph pass off a corner kick, while Twellman slotted in a Noonan pass for an early two-goal cushion ... Harrisburg's **Matt Tanzini** curled in a 30+ yard free kick in the 78th minute to cut the lead, but the Revs played up a man in the final minutes to secure their passage to the semifinals.

THIRD ROUND: Revs 4, Rochester Rhinos 2

Taylor Twellman scored two goals, and **Steve Ralston** added two goals and one assist to lift the Revs to a 4-2 victory over the Rhinos on July 10 at PAETEC Park ... Ralston gave the Revs a 1-0 lead in the 19th minute on a bending free kick, and Twellman doubled the lead in the 67th ... after Rochester tied the score with goals in the 76th and 85th minutes, Twellman scored the game-winner in the 90th off a free kick from Ralston ... Twellman was then taken down in the area in stoppage time, allowing Ralston to put the game out of reach with his successful penalty kick attempt.

HEAPS AND FRANCHINO BEEN PART OF THEM ALL

Jay Heaps and **Joe Franchino** are the only members of the Revolution who have played in all four of the team's championship matches ... Heaps is expected to start on Wednesday night against Dallas, but Franchino is out for the rest of the season while rehabilitating from July surgery on his peroneal tendon in his right ankle.

PIZZA HUT PARK PRIME CHAMPIONSHIP TERRAIN

The Revs will be playing their third championship final at Pizza Hut Park in the last three years ... New England is currently 0-2 in finals at the stadium, and is 2-3-0 overall there with victories over FC Dallas there in 2005 and 2007.

JOSEPH SEEING RED AND STAYING HOME

The Revs will be without midfielder **Shalrie Joseph** for the final as he was ejected from New England's semifinal match against Carolina on Sept. 4 ... he was ejected with a straight red card in the 42nd minute – along with former Revs teammate **Connally Edozien** – after tempers flared between the two teams following a hard **Avery John** tackle on **Johnny Steele**.

PREVIOUS MEETINGS WITH DALLAS THIS YEAR

Sept. 15, 2007: New England 4, Dallas 2 – Gillette Stadium (Foxborough, Mass.)

Pat Noonan scored two goals, while **Steve Ralston** had one goal and two assists as the Revolution earned the 4-2 victory ... Noonan struck in the 29th minute, but FCD's **Carlos Ruiz** leveled in the 35th, the first of his two goals ... after a 1-1 score at the half, Noonan struck again in the 65th minute for the go-ahead goal, and Ralston added an insurance strike in the 78th minute ... Ruiz pulled Dallas within one in the

84th minute, but **Khano Smith** capped a career night (one goal, two assists) when he unleashed a shot from outside the area that beat **Dario Sala** in the 90th minute for the final scoreline.

April 29, 2007: New England 1, Dallas 0 - Pizza Hut Park (Frisco, Texas)

Taylor Twellman scored his MLS-leading fourth goal of the season in the 13th minute and **Matt Reis** made two saves in the 1-0 victory ... **Steve Ralston** lobbed a pass over the Dallas defense to Twellman, who volleyed in a goal that won Sierra Mist Goal of the Week ... although Dallas out-shot the Revs, the New England defense limited the Hoops to mostly long-range shots to help the team post its second shutout of the season ... the victory was the Revs' second in three meetings with Dallas at the two-year old facility.

POSTSEASON TICKET PUNCHED

The Revs clinched their **sixth consecutive MLS Cup Playoffs berth** – and eighth overall – on Sept. 16, becoming the second team to punch its ticket to the postseason this year ... four of the eight teams have claimed their postseason berths so far: D.C. United, New England Revolution, Houston Dynamo and Chivas USA ... New England has advanced to an MLS-record five consecutive conference championship games and has competed in three of the last five MLS Cups.

BOSTON'S BEST IN POSTSEASON PERPETUITY

Boston is known as a sports-mad city with a rich history of championship success ... however, of Boston's five major professional sports teams - Revolution, Patriots, Bruins, Celtics and Red Sox - **the Revs hold the city's longest current streak of playoff appearances** ... having already qualified for their sixth-straight postseason, the Revs have topped the city's other pro outfits for recent postseason success ... the Revs have been in the playoffs since 2002, while the Patriots have advanced to the postseason every year since 2003 (four years straight and counting) ... the Sox did not make the playoffs last year and both the Bruins (participated last in 2004) and Celtics (participated last in 2005) also have missed the playoffs in recent years.

FALL FLAIR

Since the 2002 season, the Revolution owns a 23-9-6 record in regular-season games played after Sept. 1 ... the Revs are 2-1-1 in three games this September... last season, the Revs were 5-1-2 in that time ... since **Steve Nicol** was named head coach in 2002, the Revs have advanced to each of the last five MLS Eastern Conference Championships, winning three times and three times moving on to MLS Cup.

IS THIS YEAR MIRRORING LAST YEAR?

Last year's team closed the season with a 5-0-2 record in their final seven games ... known for putting together dramatic late-season runs into the playoffs, the Revs seem poised to parallel last year's late run ... last year's seven-game undefeated streak to close the regular-season was kick-started with a 3-0 loss at then last-place Columbus on Sept. 2 ... after that game, the Revs didn't lose in their last seven games and went all the way to MLS Cup ... this season, the Revs dropped a 4-2 decision at D.C. on Sept. 9, and followed that with a 2-0-1 record.

TWELLMAN'S TOUCHING UP THE CHARTS

Taylor Twellman scored two more goals on Saturday, Sept. 22 at New York, pushing his team-leading total to 14 ... he is currently fourth in MLS this season in scoring, even though he missed three games while away on U.S. National Team duty ... Twellman is ranked fifth on the MLS career scoring chart (89 goals), and is now seven goals back of fourth place (**Jeff Cunningham**, TFC, 96 goals) ... he is 23 goals behind career goal-scoring leader **Jaime Moreno** (112).

AN MLS RECORD FOR EACH FINGER

Steve Ralston owns five **MLS career records**, more than any other field player in league history (he's tied with Chivas USA's **Ante Razov**, who also holds five MLS career records) ... he is the league's career leader in **games** (334), **starts** (332), **minutes** (29,615), **assists** (119) and **game-winning assists** (33) ... he is also ranked **third in career corner kicks** (575) ... known more as an assist man than a goal scorer, Ralston is also ranked **15th in MLS history in goals**, notching 60 in his 12-year career.

RALSTON'S ROLLING THIS SEASON, TOO

Despite missing a total of four games this season with U.S. National Team duty and illness, **Steve Ralston** sits atop the MLS assists leader board with 12 in 23 games, ahead of Columbus' **Guillermo Barros Schelotto**, who has 10 ... Ralston now has 119

career assists, and his 12 assists this season marks his highest season total since he recorded a career-high 19 in 2002 in his first season with the Revs.

SECOND-BEST IN THE EAST

New England (49 pts.) is now both second in the Eastern Conference standings and the overall MLS table behind East leader D.C. United (53 pts.) ... the Revs are ahead of Western Conference leaders Chivas USA and Houston Dynamo, who each have 48 pts. ... if the MLS Cup Playoffs started this weekend, the Revs would be the second seed in the East and would face New York Red Bulls in the conference semifinals. (Projected seeds are as of Monday, Oct. 1.)

HOME-FIELD ADVANTAGE

New England owns a home record of 8-2-4 on the season with 30 goals scored (2.14 goals per game) ... the Revs have scored three or more goals in seven of their 14 home games ... New England's 2.14 goals per home game is MLS' second-best home scoring average, behind only D.C. United (2.69).

GILLETTE STADIUM IS REVS' HOME "TURF"

The Revs have felt quite at home this season on the FieldTurf Monofilament System installed at Gillette Stadium last November, compiling a 8-1-2 record on the artificial surface ... although the Revolution has played 14 home games, three were played on a natural grass surface that was laid for several international games played between May 26 and July 16, including the CONCACAF Gold Cup ... the team's results on the different surfaces at Gillette Stadium is remarkable, going 8-1-2 and out-scoring opponents 24-10 on the FieldTurf, while posting a 0-1-2 mark with a 6-7 goal deficit on the temporary grass ... overall this season, the Revs are 9-1-3 in games played on artificial surfaces.

CRISTMAN TOPS '07 ROOKIE POOL

With outstanding play this season on one of the league's top teams, **forward Adam Cristman** has solidified his position as the league's top rookie in 2007 ... 26 games into the season, Cristman is second among MLS rookies in goals (4) and is second in assists (4), factoring in more goals than any other first-year player ... Cristman, a fourth-round draft pick - 48th overall - in the 2007 MLS SuperDraft, has started 13 games and has appeared in 25 contests, playing just 1,136 minute and listed as the third forward on the Revs' depth chart behind MLS All-Stars and U.S. National Team members Taylor Twellman and Pat Noonan ... he leads other top rookie scorers:

- **Maurice Edu** (top overall selection by TFC) ... three goals, one assist
- **Michael Harrington** (third overall by KC) ... three goals, four assists
- **Robbie Findley** (16th overall by LA, now at RSL) ... six goals, no assists
- **Dane Richards** (19th overall by NY) ... one goal, five assists

LUXURIES OF THE ROAD

New England has laid claim to MLS' top road record this season, posting a .577 winning percentage - 6-4-3 (21 pts.) - away from home ... the Revs are 3-2-1 in their last six road games after opening the season with six of their first eight games overall away from home.

NICOL'S WINNING WAYS

Revolution head coach **Steve Nicol** is ranked ninth in MLS career wins with 75... he also has the fourth-highest winning percentage (.563) among coaches with 100 or more games coached ... Nicol has led the Revs to 269 points over his six-year coaching career, which is fourth in MLS history ... during his tenure in Foxborough - which began full-time in 2002 - Nicol has led the Revs to each of the last five Eastern Conference Championships and three of the last five MLS Cups ... the Revolution is just one of two teams (Los Angeles, 1998-2002) to reach five successive conference championship games.

TERRIBLE TWOSOME

Dating back to their days as childhood friends who would play in each other's backyards, **Taylor Twellman** and **Pat Noonan** have always had a great relationship on the field ... after finally being reunited in a full-time capacity this season after Noonan struggled to regain his form from various injuries in 2006 and early 2007, the twosome has once again emerged as one of MLS' most lethal scoring duos ... three of Noonan's four assists have come on Twellman goals this year, and all three of Twellman's assists have come on Noonan's last three goals ... in their four years together in New England, they have produced the following:

- 103 goals (67 by Twellman, 37 by Noonan)
- 49 assists (20 by Twellman, 29 by Noonan)
- 13 of Noonan's 29 assists have come on Twellman goals
- five of Twellman's 26 career assists have come on Noonan strikes

NOONAN!

Pat Noonan has regained his prime playing form that earned him MLS All-Star status and a place on the U.S. National Team ... with his two-goal effort against Dallas on

Sept. 15, Noonan now has seven goals and four assists on the season ... Noonan missed more than half the 2006 season with myriad injuries and then spent much of the 2007 preseason also rehabbing several injuries, including sports hernia surgery ... Noonan is now tied for eighth in MLS in goal scoring.

DOUBLE-DIPPING IN BACK-TO-BACK GAMES

Pat Noonan and **Taylor Twellman** struck for two-goal games on back-to-back outings recently ... on Sept. 15, Noonan had his first two-goal game since 2005 when he hit for a pair against FC Dallas ... the following weekend, Twellman had both of the Revs' goals at New York on Sept. 22, his third two-goal game of the season.

LOTS DOING THE DOUBLE, THOUGH

Revolution players have struck for multiple goals six times this season in MLS games ... **Taylor Twellman** has done it three times this year (April 14 vs. Toronto FC, May 12 at Los Angeles and Sept. 22 at New York), while **Adam Cristman** became the first Revs rookie to hit for a pair - since **Pat Noonan** in 2003 - when he scored twice against Columbus on June 16 ... **Andy Dorman** had two goals - his first-multiple-goal game - against Toronto on June 23 ... Noonan added his name to the list recently, netting two goals against Dallas on Sept. 15.

HEAPS BREAKS THROUGH

Jay Heaps scored his first goal since 2005 when he poked in a deflected ball on a Revs corner kick at D.C. on Sept. 9 ... it was his first goal since he netted the game-tying goal against the MetroStars in a 4-2 Revs victory on June 25, 2005 at Gillette Stadium ... Heaps now has 16 career goals, and eight as a member of the Revolution.

SHALRIE'S HELPERS HELPING TEAM WIN

All four of **Shalrie Joseph's** assists this season have come on game-winning goals, tying him for second in the league in the category ... Joseph's most recent helper came on Khano Smith's 88th minute goal on Sept. 29 in the 1-0 victory over Colorado ... he has also assisted on two Taylor Twellman game-winners (May 12 at Los Angeles, 85th minute; Aug. 19 at Kansas City, 72nd minute) and one Andy Dorman goal (July 14 at New York, 38th minute).

SMITH HAS HOT SEPTEMBER

Khano Smith had a memorable September, scoring two goals and adding two assists ... he had one of his best games as a member of the Revs on Sept. 15 against Dallas, scoring one goal - his first of 2007 - and adding an assist for his first-career multiple-point game ... on a day when he ran nearly unimpeded up and down the left wing, Smith was active with several dangerous crosses, including the one that connected with Pat Noonan for the team's first goal ... Smith also assisted on Taylor Twellman's goal at D.C. on Sept 9, and then scored the game-winning goal against Columbus on Sept. 29 in the 88th minute ... In September, Smith was active in the goal-scoring in three of the team's four league contests ... Smith now has two goals and a career-high six assists this season, his third with the Revs.

TORRID SCORING

The Revs are among the league's leaders in scoring, netting 1.70 goals per game, putting them in second place in the league in a tightly-contested scoring race ... the Revs are also in second place in overall scoring with 46 goals in 27 games, seven goals back of leader D.C. ... the team's 46 goals this season has surpassed the team's entire 32-game total from 2006 (39 goals for a 1.22 goals per game mark) ... with eight three-goal games this year, New England is second in MLS in the category, and is ranked second in overall multiple-goal games with 14.

REIS' PIECES
