NEW ENGLAND VS. HOUSTON SERIES INFORMATION

- New England and Houston have met just four times in the overall MLS regular-season series, with the Revs holding a slight edge with a 1-0-3 mark against the Dynamo
- This season, the Revs narrowly won the season series, going 1-0-1 against Houston ... last year, the teams played to a pair of 1-1 draws in the regular season
- New England earned the first win in the series by either team in the first meeting this season, taking a 1-0 win in Houston on May 19 ... Shalrie Joseph scored in the ninth minute and the Revs' defense held on for the win
- July's meeting – a 3-3 back-and-forth draw at Gillette Stadium – was the first time either team scored more than one goal in the series
- The Revs have never been shut out by the Dynamo, but have posted one defensive shutout (May 19, 2007 in Houston).
- Seven New England players have started all four matches against Houston

POSTSEASON NOTES

- The teams met in last year's MLS Cup, where the Dynamo won the title behind a 4-3 victory in penalty kicks after the teams played to a 1-1 draw after extra time
- Taylor Twellman scored for the Revs in the 113th minute, but Houston's Brian Ching responded in the 114th minute to force penalties.

PLAYER NOTES VS. HOUSTON

- **Shalrie Joseph** has scored two goals against Houston, one coming in each meeting this season ... on May 19, he struck the game-winning goal, and his penalty-kick tally on July 22 was the game-tying goal
- **Pat Noonan** has scored one goal and added two assists against Houston, all coming in four games
- **Taylor Twellman** has one goal and one assist against the Dynamo
- **Steve Ralston** has scored one goal (May 27, 2006) and added one assist against Houston
- **Matt Reis** is 1-0-3 against the Dynamo in his career with a 1.25 goals against average with one shutout and 18 saves in four starts

2007 SEASON MEETINGS

New England 1, Houston 0

May 19, 2007 – Robertson Stadium (Houston, Texas)

Shalrie Joseph scored in the ninth minute – a scorcher from outside the area after Steve Ralston's cross in to Taylor Twellman was deflected out to Joseph – and the Revolution held on to earn a 1-0 victory on May 19, 2007 at Robertson Stadium ... the win extended New England undefeated streak to a season-best seven games ... the Revs were out-shot 11-3 in the game, and Matt Reis – in his third shutout of the season – twice stopped Ricardo Clark in the second half on prime chances.

New England 3, Houston 3

July 22, 2007 – Gillette Stadium (Foxborough, Mass.)

The Revs had a 1-0 lead at the first half, courtesy of a Pat Noonan goal on the 32nd minute, but Dwayne DeRosario's goal in the 49th minute leveled the score ... Taylor Twellman again gave the Revs a one-goal lead in the 51st minute, but Brian Ching struck twice in one minute (60th, 61st minutes) to put the Dynamo on top ... the Revs got the leveler in the 66th minute, courtesy of a Shalrie Joseph penalty kick after DeRosario committed a handball foul in the box on a Revs free kick.

MLS CUP NOTES

REVOLUTION TEAM NOTES

- This is New England's fourth appearance in MLS Cup ... the team also played in MLS Cups 2002, 2005 and 2006 ... the Revs join D.C. United and the Los Angeles Galaxy as the only teams to make four or more MLS Cup appearances
- This is the team's third straight appearance in the Cup final ... only D.C. United (four straight seasons, 1996-1999) can also make such a claim
- For the second time in as many seasons, both Houston and New England have advanced to MLS Cup, marking the first time the same teams are playing in MLS Cup in back-to-back years
- This is the second time New England is playing in MLS Cup at an Eastern Conference venue ... in 2002, the Revs played at their home Gillette Stadium, while they played MLS Cups 2005 and 2006 at Pizza Hut Park (home of FC Dallas of the Western Conference)
- All three of the MLS Cup finals that the Revolution has appeared in have gone to overtime ... in 2002, Los Angeles defeated the Revs on Carlos Ruiz's goal in golden-goal overtime ... in 2005, the Galaxy's Guillermo Ramirez scored the game-winner in the 107th minute ... in 2006, the Revs took a 1-0 lead in the 113th minute on Taylor Twellman's goal, but Houston's Brian Ching tied it one minute later and the Dynamo later won on penalty kicks, 4-3
- New England has scored just once in MLS Cup play – in 2006 on Taylor Twellman's goal from Khano Smith
- For the first time this season, the Revs did not ride a strong late-season push into the playoffs ... in 2002, the Revs went 3-0-0 after Sept. 1 to storm into the playoffs ... in 2005, the team put together a 4-2-2 run after Sept. 1 to advance to MLS Cup ... in 2006, the Revs rode a seven-game unbeaten streak (5-0-2) into the playoffs ... this season, New England went 2-3-2 after Sept. 1 entering the playoffs, including a three-game winless streak to close the season

REVOLUTION PLAYER NOTES

- Four current members of the Revolution roster have appeared in the team's three previous MLS Cup appearances: **Joe Franchino**, **Jay Heaps**, **Steve Ralston** and **Taylor Twellman** ... only Franchino (season-ending ankle injury and surgery) will be unavailable for Sunday's championship
- **Matt Reis**, **Shalrie Joseph**, **Pat Noonan** and **Michael Parkhurst** have each made two MLS Cup appearances, all coming in 2005 and 2006, each making starts in both of their appearances ... **Andy Dorman** has two appearances to his name, a substitute appearance in 2005 and a start in 2006
- **Avery John**, **Jeff Larentowicz**, **James Riley** and **Khano Smith** each have one MLS Cup appearance to their credit
- **Taylor Twellman** has scored the Revs' only goal in MLS Cup play ... Twellman's goal in the 113th minute last year against Houston snapped the Revs' 345-minute scoreless streak in MLS Cup action
- **Khano Smith** has the team's only assist in championship-game action
- **Matt Reis** is 0-1-1 in MLS Cup, with a 0.75 goals against average and 10 saves ... both goals he has surrendered have come in extra time
- **Joe Franchino** was booked for a caution in each of the team's three previous MLS Cup appearances

IS THE FOURTH TIME IS THE CHARM?

The Revolution have now advanced to its fourth MLS Cup final in team history, all coming in the last six years ... the team has also now qualified for each of the last three MLS Cup championship matches ... however, the team enters the 2007 final 0-3 all-time at MLS Cup.

WINNING PRECEDENCE SET BY GALAXY

The Revs are the third team to make at least four appearances in MLS Cup, joining D.C. United and the Los Angeles Galaxy, which have five appearances each ... the Revs can look to L.A. for inspiration, however, as the Galaxy won its first of two MLS Cup championships in its fourth title game appearance (2002 vs. New England).

RECORD-SETTING STREAK FOR THE REVS

The Revs are coming into MLS Cup after earning a victory in their MLS-record sixth consecutive conference championship match appearance ... entering this season, the Revs shared the MLS record for continuous appearances in the conference championship match with the 1998-2002 Los Angeles Galaxy.

FAMILIAR FINALS

With the team's appearance in this year's MLS Cup, the Revolution has pushed its total cup final appearances to six ... the Revs are making their second appearance in a final this season, having also won the 2007 Open Cup title, which gave the team its first piece of tournament hardware in club history ... it was also the first time in team history it did not need overtime to determine a champion on cup final history.

GOING FOR THE ELUSIVE DOUBLE

Having already won the 2007 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, the Revs will now **try to win the "Domestic Double"** with a victory at MLS Cup ... Los Angeles was the last team to successfully complete the double, winning both tournaments in 2005 ... overall, **three teams have won both domestic championships:** the 1996 D.C. United team, the 1998 Chicago Fire team and the 2005 Los Angeles Galaxy squad ... including the Revs this season, **seven teams have had the opportunity to win both championships:** 1996 D.C. United, 1998 Chicago Fire, 2000 Chicago Fire, 2001 Los Angeles Galaxy, 2003 Chicago Fire, 2005 Los Angeles Galaxy and 2007 New England Revolution.

NEW SURROUNDINGS ...

The Revs will attempt to win their first-ever MLS Cup championship at RFK Stadium in Washington, D.C., next Sunday, Nov. 18 ... playing for a title in D.C. – or even the Eastern Time Zone – is pretty unfamiliar for the Revs as they have played four of their five previous finals in the Central or Pacific time zones ... Washington, D.C., and RFK Stadium are hosting MLS Cup for the third time (1997, 2000), matching the three times Foxborough has hosted MLS Cup (1996 and 1999 at Foxboro Stadium, 2000 at Gillette Stadium).

... BUT FAMILIAR OPPONENT

For the first time in MLS Cup history, the same teams will be vying for the MLS championship in back-to-back seasons ... last season New England and Houston needed penalty kicks to determine the champion at Pizza Hut Park in Frisco, Texas.

CONFERENCE SUCCESS ON FAMILIAR FIELDS

In the 10 MLS Cups in which the Eastern and Western Conference representatives have faced each other, the team playing on the field of its conference brethren is 8-2 in championship action ... Eastern Conference teams are 4-1 when playing for MLS Cup on Eastern Conference teams' home fields (the lone loss was in 2002 when New England lost to Los Angeles in Foxborough) ... Western Conference teams are also 4-1 when MLS Cup is played in Western Conference venues (D.C. defeated Kansas City, then playing in the West, in 2004 in Carson).

SHUTOUT SUPREME

The Revs have posted **three consecutive shutouts to open the MLS Cup Playoffs** for the first time in team history ... overall, the Revs have posted **four shutouts in their last five playoff games**, dating back to 2006 ... in that same span, New England has allowed just **one goal in 480 minutes** ... since the start of the 2006 MLS Cup Playoffs, the Revs have recorded a **0.39 goals against average with four shutouts in those seven games** ... the last time New England posted three consecutive shutouts in postseason action was during its 2002 run to MLS Cup, when the Revs posted shutouts in the final game of the Eastern Conference Semifinal Series against Chicago and the first two games of the Eastern Conference Final against Columbus..

DEFENSIVE POSTURING

Although the Revs recorded **10 shutouts in the regular season**, they only had two in the final third of the year, the last coming on Sept. 29 against Colorado ... however, the Revs **have not allowed a goal yet this postseason**, posting three straight shutouts in the Eastern Conference Semifinal Series against New York and the Eastern Conference Championship against Chicago ... in the semifinal series, **Matt Reis** made five saves in Game One at Giants Stadium and four saves in Game Two at Gillette Stadium, following that effort with a **career-high 10 saves** in the Eastern Conference Championship against Chicago.

PLAYOFF PROCEDURE

Sunday's game will be a normal 90-minute contest ... however, should the score be tied after 90 minutes, the teams would play a 30-minute mini-game (two 15-minute halves) immediately following full time to determine a winner ... should the score still remain tied after the mini-game, penalty kicks would be used to determine the winner.

PLAYOFF SUCCESS

Now in the midst of its eighth MLS Cup Playoffs campaign, the Revolution is still searching for the team's first-ever MLS Cup victory ... the Revs have seen tremendous playoff success recently, having played in:

- four of the last six MLS Cup Championship matches and three straight
- six straight Eastern Conference Championship matches (MLS record)
- six straight MLS Cup Playoffs

RALSTON ONLY REMAINING RINGLESS MLS "ORIGINAL"

As one of seven remaining MLS "Originals" – players who have played every season in MLS since its inception in 1996 – **Steve Ralston** has seen a lot of time, both in the regular season and in the playoffs ... however, Ralston is the **only remaining MLS "Original" who has not won an MLS Cup** with any of his teams: Chris Armas (CHI in 1998), Jesse Marsch (DC in 1996 and 1997, CHI in 1998), Cobi Jones (LA in 2002 and 2005), Jaime Moreno (DC in 1996, 1997, 1999 and 2004), Ante Razov (CHI in 1998) and Eddie Pope (DC in 1996, 1997 and 1999).

RALSTON TO SET U.S. RECORD FOR APPEARANCES

By playing in the Eastern Conference Championship, **Steve Ralston** tied the all-time record for **games played in American first-division professional soccer** ... Ralston played in his **370th first-division game** last Thursday in the team's 1-0 victory over Chicago ... he enters MLS Cup 2007 tied with Bill McPherson of the old American Soccer League in the 1920s and 1930s, who also made 370 appearances ... when he takes his customary place in the Revs' starting lineup against Houston on Sunday, **Ralston will set a new standard in professional soccer with his 371st professional appearance** ... the U.S. Soccer Hall of Fame has been keeping the professional records, which include all statistics from first-division soccer - regular-season and postseason and the U.S. Open Cup.

TWELLMAN CONTINUES POSTSEASON SCORING BINGE

In the Revs' last six postseason games, **Taylor Twellman** has scored five goals – including three game-winning strikes ... he now has nine career postseason goals to rank tied for seventh in the MLS career postseason records ... in the current streak, Twellman scored against Chicago in Game Two of the 2006 Eastern Conference Semifinal, against D.C. in the 2006 Eastern Conference Championship, against Houston in MLS Cup 2006, in Game Two of the 2007 Eastern Conference Semifinal against New York and in the 2007 Eastern Conference Championship against Chicago.

TWELLMAN TURNED UP THE HEAT JUST IN TIME

Taylor Twellman scored seven goals in the team's last nine regular-season games – eight in which he played, and including the playoffs, has scored **nine goals in the team's last 12 games overall** ... beginning on Aug. 19 at Kansas City, Twellman has averaged just under one goal a game – scoring in every game except two: against FC Dallas on Sept. 15 and at Chicago on Oct. 6 (and at New York on Oct. 27 in Game One of the Eastern Conference Semifinal Series) ... he did not play in the Colorado game at home on Sept. 29 while recovering from a groin strain related to his past hernia surgeries.

REIS AMONG MLS CAREER POSTSEASON LEADERS

Matt Reis is listed in nine different MLS career postseason records: **goals against average (first, 0.63 GAA)**, **saves percentage (first, 83.3 percent)**, shutouts (tied for fourth, 7), saves (fourth, 70), wins (tied for fifth, 8), and winning percentage (fifth, .633), as well as appearances in goal (tied for fifth, 15), starts in goal (tied for sixth, 14) and minutes played in goal (sixth, 1,431).

REVOLUTION RULE THE SECOND SEASON KEEPER RECORDS

The Revolution own the top two spots in the MLS career postseason goals against records as current goalkeeper **Matt Reis** and former keeper **Adin Brown** occupy the first and second spots, respectively ... Reis just leap-frogged Brown into first place after the Eastern Conference Championship, lowering his career postseason goals against

average to 0.63 in 15 postseason appearances ... Brown is second with a 0.66 GAA in 10 playoffs appearances.

NICOL'S WINNING WAYS

Revolution head coach **Steve Nicol** is ranked ninth in MLS career wins with 75... he also has the fourth-highest winning percentage (.557) among coaches with 100 or more games coached ... Nicol has led the Revs to 270 points over his six-year coaching career, which is the fourth-highest total in MLS history ... during his tenure in Foxborough – which began full-time in 2002 – Nicol has led the Revs to each of the last six Eastern Conference Championships and four of the last six MLS Cups – including each of the last three ... the Revolution is the only team in MLS history reach six successive conference championship games and just the second team to go to three straight MLS finals.

AND NICOL'S MASTERFUL SUCCESS IN THE PLAYOFFS

Steve Nicol has coached more games in the MLS Cup Playoffs than all but two coaches in the history of the league, and this year becomes the only coach in MLS history to lead a team to MLS Cup four times ... Bruce Arena (D.C., 1996-98) and Sigi Schmid (L.A., 1999, 2001-02) have coached teams to three MLS Cups ... Nicol has now coached 24 postseason games, and only Bob Bradley (30) and Schmid (26) have coached more games in the second season ... Nicol has also collected 10 wins, the fourth-highest total among all coaches (only behind Schmid – 16, and Bradley and Arena – 14 each).

BOSTON'S BEST IN POSTSEASON PERPETUITY

Boston is known as a sports-mad city with a rich history of championship success ... however, of Boston's five major professional sports teams - Revolution, Patriots, Bruins, Celtics and Red Sox - the **Revs hold the city's longest current streak of playoff appearances** ... competing in their sixth straight postseason, the Revs have topped the city's other pro outfits for recent postseason success ... the Revs have been in the playoffs since 2002, while the Patriots have advanced to the postseason every year since 2003 (four years straight and counting) ... the Sox did not make the playoffs last year and both the Bruins (participated last in 2004) and Celtics (participated last in 2005) also have missed the playoffs in recent years.

CITY'S CHAMPIONSHIP FEVER INCLUDES REVS

With the Red Sox winning the World Series, the Patriots starting the season 8-0 and the Boston College football team ranked in the top 10 in nation, there is much anticipation for multiple championships in Boston this season... that eagerness for trophies should also include the Revs as they have already won the U.S. Open Cup and have a chance to complete the rare "domestic double" by winning MLS Cup 2007.

PARKHURST IS THE TOP DEFENDER

Last week, **Michael Parkhurst** was named the 2007 MLS Visa Defender of the Year, marking his first league award as the top defender ... Parkhurst was a finalist with Houston's Eddie Robinson and Chivas USA's Claudio Suarez ... the award is Parkhurst's fourth major season-ending MLS award, having also won the 2005 Gatorade Rookie of the Year, 2006 U.S. Soccer Humanitarian of the Year and 2007 Individual Fair Play Award ... at just 23 years of age, Parkhurst is a two-time MLS All-Star and a member of the U.S. National Team player pool.

PARKHURST ALSO WINS FAIR PLAY AWARD

Defender **Michael Parkhurst** won the 2007 MLS Fair Play Award, the league announced on Wednesday ... the central defender committed just five fouls in 25 games, and also went without earning a booking during the regular season.

AND HIS GOAL IS A GOAL OF THE YEAR FINALIST

For all the acclaim he's earned on the far side of the midfield line, central defender **Michael Parkhurst** has garnered attention for one other play ... his 60-yard goal from behind the midfield line at Toronto on Oct. 20 is among the five finalists for MLS Sierra Mist Goal of the Year ... the most unlikely player in MLS to score a goal, **Parkhurst** intercepted a pass in the Reds' midfield, stepped up and chipped Toronto keeper Kenny Stamatopoulos from several yards behind the midfield line ... it was Parkhurst's first-ever MLS goal on his **FIRST-EVER shot in MLS**.

REVS CHOCK FULL OF AWARD FINALISTS

Four members of the Revolution were named finalists for five different MLS awards ... defender **Michael Parkhurst** is a finalist for Defender of the Year, as well as the Fair Play Award, which he won... forward **Pat Noonan** was a finalist for the Comeback Player of the Year ... goalkeeper **Matt Reis** was a finalist for Panasonic Goalkeeper of the Year ... forward **Adam Cristman** was a finalist for Gatorade Rookie of the Year ... with five finalists in eight award categories, the Revolution is the most-represented team among the award finalists.

JOSEPH IS THE MAN IN THE MIDDLE

Shalrie Joseph controlled all aspects of the midfield in the Revs' 2007 MLS Cup Playoffs run ... including an assist on Taylor Twellman's series-winning goal in Game Two, Joseph also helped shut down the Red Bulls' attack that had scored 47 goals – the league's third-highest total behind **Juan Pablo Angel** and **Jozy Altidore** – in the regular season, and also controlled the midfield – and the Fire's mercurial **Cuauhtemoc Blanco** – in the Eastern Conference Championship against Chicago.

AND A ROOKIE BREAKS OUT

Wells Thompson has made a statement in the postseason ... the fifth overall selection in the 2007 MLS SuperDraft, Thompson appeared in 27 games during the regular season, starting 11, **enduring an up-and-down season as he learned the ropes in the professional game** ... however in the postseason, he's started all three games and has been a **key performer in each** ... in Game One of the Eastern Conference Semifinal Series against New York, he put on a stellar defensive display while helping the Revs earn the vital 0-0 draw on the road against a potent Red Bulls attack ... in Game Two, he ran up and down the right wing, both producing on the attacking end and helping on the defensive side as the Revs posted another shutout in the 1-0 victory ... **his breakout moment came in the Eastern Conference Championship** when he sent in the cross that Taylor Twellman converted with a spectacular bicycle kick that stood as the game-winning goal in the 38th minute.

TORRID SCORING

The Revs finished second in the MLS scoring race, netting 51 goals (1.70 goals per game) in league action... the team's 51 goals this season surpassed the team's entire 32-game total from 2006 (39 goals for a 1.22 goals per game mark) ... with eight three-goal games this year, New England was tied for second in MLS in the category, and was second ranked in multiple-goal games with 16.

RALSTON WINS 2007 ASSIST RACE

Captain **Steve Ralston** – all 33 years of age – won the **2007 MLS assist title** this year, recording a league-best 14 assists ... this is his third league assist title, also leading the league in 1999 (18 assists) and 2002 (19 assists) ... Ralston is the MLS career leader in assists, recording 121 in his 12-year MLS career ... his 14 assists this season marked his highest-single season total since he had 19 in 2002, his first season in New England.

TWELLMAN'S TOUCHING UP THE CHARTS

Taylor Twellman added another goal to his scoring total in the final regular-season game, pushing his season total to 16 ... he finished third in MLS in scoring this year, even though he missed three games while away on U.S. National Team duty ... Twellman is ranked fifth on the MLS career scoring chart (91 goals), and is now five goals back of fourth place (Jeff Cunningham, TFC, 96 goals) ... he will begin the 2008 season 21 goals behind career goal-scoring leader Jaime Moreno (112).

TWELLMAN, PARKHURST SWEEP 2007 TEAM AWARDS

Taylor Twellman and **Michael Parkhurst** swept the 2007 Revolution Team Awards, which were presented in a pregame ceremony on Saturday, Oct. 13 ... Twellman won three awards: Team MVP, Budweiser Golden Boot and the Midnight Riders' Man of the Year ... Parkhurst was named Revolution Defender of the Year and the Revs' U.S. Soccer Foundation Humanitarian of the Year ... it was Twellman's third team MVP award, fifth Golden Boot and fourth Man of the Year honor ... for Parkhurst, it was his second Defender of the Year nod and second consecutive humanitarian honor.

ATTENDANCE HAS BLOSSOMED

OPEN CUP WINNERS!

On Wednesday, Oct. 3, the New England Revolution won their **first-ever cup championship**, taking the 2007 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup with a 3-2 victory over host FC Dallas ... **Pat Noonan** factored in all three goals to be named man of the match, including setting up **Wells Thompson's** game-winning goal in the second half ... Noonan scored the game's first goal before assisting on **Taylor Twellman's** go-ahead goal and Thompson's game-winning goal to help the Revs lift the U.S. Open Cup for the first time ever ... Twellman's goal was his fourth of the tournament and pushed his U.S. Open scoring streak to four straight games in which he played, dating back to 2006.

AN MLS RECORD FOR EACH FINGER ... AND A SURPRISE STAT

Steve Ralston owns five **MLS career records**, tied with Chivas USA's Ante Razov, for the most MLS career records of any player ... he is the league's career leader in **games (337), starts (335), minutes (29,885), assists (121) and game-winning assists (33)** ... he is also **tied for second in career corner kicks (593)** ... known more as an assist

man than a goal scorer, Ralston is also **tied with New York's Clint Mathis for 14th in MLS history in goals**, notching 61 in his 12-year career.

ANOTHER MAN WITH LONGEVITY

In addition to Steve Ralston holding down the MLS career record for minutes played, Revs defender **Jay Heaps** crept onto the list at the end of the season ... Heaps moved into 10th place on the career chart having played 22,493 minutes in his nine-year professional career.

JOSEPH, HEAPS RE-SIGN

The Revs announced on Thursday, Oct. 18, that All-Star midfielder **Shalrie Joseph** and defender **Jay Heaps** had signed long-term contract extensions to play for the club ... terms of the deals were not released ... Joseph is in his fifth season in MLS, all with the Revs, while Heaps is in his seventh in New England and ninth overall ... Joseph is a four-time MLS All-Star and a Best XI selection in 2005 ... Heaps was the 1999 MLS Rookie of the Year and holds the Revs club records in appearances, starts and minutes.

REIS' PIECES

Goalkeeper **Matt Reis** matched his single-season best when he recorded his 10th shutout of the season on Sept. 29, registering a 1-0 victory over Colorado with three saves ... he finished third in shutouts to Chivas USA's Brad Guzan (13) ... since the 2005 season, Reis has recorded more shutouts - 30 - than any other goalkeeper in MLS ... Reis matched his single-season best of 10 shutouts which he accomplished in 32-game seasons (2005 & 2006).

... AND THE REVS' MINUTE MAN

Since returning from a one-game red card suspension on Sept. 3, 2005, goalkeeper **Matt Reis** has started and played 90 minutes (and all extra-time sessions) in each of the Revs' last 81 MLS matches - including eight playoff games - to push his consecutive-minutes played mark to 7,180 minutes ... in just regular-season matches, he's played 6,300 consecutive minutes, which is the second-longest streak in MLS history behind Pat Onstad's record streak of 6,648 (2005-2007).
