NEW ENGLAND VS. REAL SALT LAKE SERIES INFORMATION

- New England and Real Salt Lake have met just six times in the overall series - all during the MLS regular season - with the Revs holding a 3-1-2 advantage.
- The Revolution has never lost at Rice-Eccles Stadium, going 2-0-1 in three trips to Salt Lake City ... the teams have played evenly in New England, splitting three games, 1-1-1.
- The Revs won the 2007 season series, 1-0-1 ... the teams battled to a scoreless draw in New England on June 2 despite New England out-shooting RSL, 23-8, as Salt Lake's Nick Rimando made 13 saves in the shutout ... **Jeff Larentowicz's** 82nd-minute free kick earned the Revolution a 2-1 win at Rice-Eccles Stadium on July 28.
- New England had gone winless against RSL in three straight games (0-1-2) before its 2-1 victory in the most recent meeting on July 28, 2007 at Rice-Eccles Stadium.
- There have been just four total goals scored in the teams' three meetings in Salt Lake City (three for the Revs, one for RSL) ... three of the four goals were scored in the most recent match-up, a 2-1 win for New England on July 28, 2007.
- The Revs have shut out Real Salt Lake three times in their six meetings, and have held RSL to just five total goals ... New England has been shut out twice by Real Salt Lake, both in scoreless draws.

PLAYER NOTES VS. REAL SALT LAKE

- **Taylor Twellman** and **Khano Smith** have each scored two goals against Real Salt Lake to lead the Revs.
- Two of **Khano Smith's** seven career regular-season goals have been against Real Salt Lake, and both came in his rookie year of 2005 ... both goals were scored after the 75th minute after coming on as a late substitute.
- **Jeff Larentowicz** has one goal and one assist against RSL, both of which came in the teams' most recent meeting on July 28, 2007 ... Larentowicz scored the game-winner on a free kick in the 82nd minute.
- Defenders **Jay Heaps** and **Chris Albright** lead New England with two assists each against RSL ... both of Albright's assists came during his time with the Los Angeles Galaxy.
- **Matt Reis**, **Jay Heaps**, **Michael Parkhurst** and **Shalrie Joseph** have all played every minute of every game against RSL (six games, 540 minutes).
- **Matt Reis** is 3-1-2 in his career against Real Salt Lake, posting an 0.83 goals against average and three shutouts.

LAST MEETING

New England 2, Real Salt Lake 1

July 28, 2007 – Rice-Eccles Stadium (Salt Lake City, Utah)

Jeff Larentowicz scored the game-winning goal and added an assist to help lift the Revs over RSL, 2-1, as New England won the season series and remained undefeated at Rice-Eccles Stadium ... **Pat Noonan** opened the scoring in the 39th minute to give the Revs the halftime lead ... Larentowicz lobbed a pass over the Real Salt Lake backline which **Taylor Twellman** latched on to, and Twellman laid the ball off for a streaking Noonan to finish past RSL goalkeeper Nick Rimando ... the hosts were reduced to 10 men in the 67th minute when former Rev Andy Williams was shown a straight red card for a tackle on **Andy Dorman** ... despite being down a man, Real Salt Lake leveled the score in the 72nd minute, as Carey Talley finished his penalty kick attempt after Kyle Beckerman was fouled in the box ... Larentowicz won the game for the Revs with an 82nd-minute free kick, blasting a rocket from 25 yards out across the goal and inside the left post.

MISCELLANEOUS TEAM NOTES

ALONE AT THE TOP

The Revs currently stand alone atop the Eastern Conference and MLS standings with an 8-3-3 record for 27 points ... however, because of the club's in-season participation in Super-Liga and the CONCACAF Champions League in the coming months, New England has played a league-high 14 games ... five teams in the league have played 13 games, while seven have played 12 ... Kansas City is the only team in the league to have played just 11 games.

REVS STRETCH LEAGUE-BEST UNBEATEN STREAK TO SEVEN

New England's 1-1 draw with New York at Gillette Stadium on Wednesday night extended the club's unbeaten streak to seven games, which represents the longest unbeaten run by any team in the league this season ... both Columbus and Toronto FC put together six-game unbeaten runs earlier this season ... the streak is the Revolution's longest since April 14-May 19, 2007, when the club also went 5-0-2 over a seven-game stretch ... it is the seventh time in club history that the Revolution has put together an unbeaten streak spanning at least seven games, with the longest being a 12-game run from Oct. 16, 2004-June 11, 2005 ... during that stretch, the Revs won the final game of the 2004 season before opening the 2005 campaign 7-0-4.

REVOLUTION MAINTAINS LEAGUE LEAD IN POINTS-PER-GAME

With the club's 1-1 draw with New York on Wednesday night at Gillette Stadium, the Revolution maintained the best points-per-game average in MLS ... the Revs have earned 1.93 points per game, while Columbus (1.83) is second in the category ... Chicago had earned 1.73 points per game heading into its Thursday-night match with Chivas USA, with the chance to equal Columbus' mark of 1.83 points per game with a victory ... the coaching staff of the team with the highest points per game average as of June 29 will serve as the coaching staff for the MLS All-Stars against English Premier League side West Ham United on Thursday, July 24, at Toronto's BMO Field.

REVS UNDEFEATED AT RICE-ECCLES STADIUM

In three all-time meetings between New England and Real Salt Lake at Rice-Eccles Stadium, the Revs are an undefeated 2-0-1 ... the Revolution earned a 1-0 win in the first-ever meeting in Salt Lake City on Sept. 3, 2005, before battling to a 0-0 draw on June 24, 2006 ... in the most recent match between the two sides on July 28, 2007, New England used an 82nd-minute free kick by **Jeff Larentowicz** to earn a 2-1 road win.

GETTING DEFENSIVE AGAINST REAL SALT LAKE

In six all-time meetings with Real Salt Lake, the Revs have allowed a total of just five goals (0.83 goals against per game) ... in the teams' three meetings in Salt Lake City, New England has allowed just one goal ... the Revs have shut out RSL three times, while they've held the 2005 expansion team to a single goal on two other occasions ... three of Salt Lake's five goals in the series were scored in a 3-1 win at Gillette Stadium on July 19, 2006.

FOUR REVS REPRESENT COUNTRIES IN QUALIFIERS

Shalrie Joseph (Grenada), **Matt Reis** (United States), **Kenny Mansally** (Gambia) and **Khano Smith** (Bermuda) all represented their national teams in World Cup Qualifiers last weekend ... Joseph played the full 90 minutes as Grenada drew with Costa Rica, 2-2, at Grenada National Stadium on Saturday (June 14) ... Reis was available on the bench for the United States' 8-0 win over Barbados on Sunday (June 15), but did not see game action ... Mansally earned his first cap for Gambia's senior national team, entering in the 75th minute as Gambia defeated Algeria, 1-0, on June 14 in Gambia ... Smith played the full 90 minutes as Bermuda shocked Trinidad & Tobago, 2-1, on June 15 in Trinidad ... Joseph, Mansally and Smith are expected to miss the Revolution's match at Real Salt Lake (June 21) while with their national teams for further qualifiers ... Gambia will travel to Algeria on June 20, Grenada will travel to Costa Rica on June 21, and Bermuda will host Trinidad & Tobago on June 22.

SHALRIE'S SURPRISE

Much to the surprise - and delight - of the Revolution's coaching staff, **Shalrie Joseph** returned to New England in between World Cup Qualifiers for Grenada to start in the 1-1 draw with New York on Wednesday night ... no one was aware of Joseph's plan to return to the squad until he showed up ready for training on Tuesday morning ... Joseph played the full 90 minutes in Grenada's 2-2 draw with Costa Rica on Saturday, June 14, before returning to Foxborough to join the Revs ... after Wednesday night's match, the perennial MVP candidate departed for Costa Rica to meet up with his countrymen ahead of the second leg of their World Cup Qualifying series on Saturday, June 21.

ROAD WARRIORS

With yet another win on the road at Houston on June 12, New England continued its remarkable success away from home this season ... with a 5-1-1 mark (.786 winning percentage) away from home this year, the Revolution leads the league in road success ... the Revs' five wins are the most in the league, while Chicago is second with four wins away from home ... New England is currently riding a six-game road-unbeaten streak, which is the longest such streak in the league this season ... in contrast, Real Salt Lake is undefeated at home (3-0-4).

CONQUERING THE WESTERN FRONTIER

New England is 6-1-0 against Western Conference teams this season, with its only blemish a 1-0 loss to Colorado on April 12 at Gillette Stadium ... the Revs are an undefeated 3-0-0 on the road against Western Conference teams, with wins at Dallas (April 24), Chivas USA (May 11) and Houston (June 12).

REIS NEVER CEASES TO AMAZE ...

Goalkeeper **Matt Reis** made five saves - including a diving stop of an 82nd-minute penalty kick - to secure his league-leading fifth shutout of the season last Thursday night in the Revolution's 2-0 win at Houston (June 12) ... the clean sheet was Reis' 35th since the start of the 2005 season, which represents the highest total by any goalkeeper in that same span ... Reis holds MLS' record for consecutive (regular-season) minutes played, standing in the New England goal for the last 7,560 minutes of game action dating back to Sept. 3, 2005 ... overall, Reis has stood in goal and played every minute (including overtime if played) in each of the Revs' last 96 MLS matches - regular-season and playoffs - dating back to September 2005, a span of 8,640 minutes, although MLS does not recognize that record ... the Revs' goalkeeper is currently ranked second in MLS in goals against average (1.07) and has recorded 54 saves to rank second in MLS in the category.

... AND IS REWARDED WITH U.S. CALL-UP

Matt Reis was rewarded for his impressive recent form with a call-up to the United States National Team for its World Cup Qualifier against Barbados on Sunday, June 15 ... Reis was selected to join the side after starting goalkeeper Tim Howard picked up an injury in training on Friday ... Brad Guzan started the match between the pipes for the U.S., while Reis was available on the bench as a backup ... overall, Reis has made two appearances for the U.S., going 1-0-1 with one shutout.

REIS RACKING UP THE FREQUENT FLYER MILES

Over a 10-day span from June 11-20, **Matt Reis** traveled a total of 12,767 miles, while making stops in all four time zones ... road games at Houston (June 12) and Real Salt Lake (June 21), coupled with a call-up to the United States National Team for a World Cup Qualifier at the Home Depot Center in Carson, Calif. (June 15), contributed to the travel schedule ... the goalkeeper has flown from Boston to Houston (June 11), Houston to Boston (June 13), Boston to Los Angeles (June 14), Los Angeles to Boston (June 16) and Boston to Salt Lake City (June 20).

REIS AND RIMANDO PROVIDE GOALKEEPING SHOWDOWN

Matt Reis and **Nick Rimando** - who should oppose each other as the goalkeepers for New England and Real Salt Lake, respectively, on Saturday night - are currently tied with each other for sixth place on MLS' career shutout list (47) ... Reis has three shutouts in six games against RSL, while Rimando has shut out the Revs on one occasion - a 13-save effort in a 0-0 draw on June 2, 2007.

RALSTON STAYS WHITE-HOT

With his game-tying goal in the 79th-minute of the 1-1 draw with New York on Wednesday night, **Steve Ralston** has now scored the decisive goal in each of the Revolution's last three matches ... the midfielder - who recently turned 34 - also scored the game-winning goals against FC Dallas (June 6) and at Houston (June 12) ... in fact, three of Ralston's four goals this season have been game-winners, tying him with Los Angeles' Edson Buddle for the league-lead in that category ... Ralston's four goals and three assists tie him with **Kheli Dube** for the team-lead in both categories ... the last time Ralston scored goals in three straight games was when he was with Tampa Bay in 2001, when he scored on April 7, 14 and 21.

RALSTON CONTRIBUTING HIS FAIR SHARE

MLS' original "Iron Man," **Steve Ralston** - who celebrated his 34th birthday recently - has been celebrating a lot recently, as he's been involved in the game-winning or game-tying goal in each of the Revs last seven games, spanning the club's current undefeated streak (5-0-2) ... Ralston had the game-winning assist against both Chivas USA (May 11) and San Jose (May 17) before drawing the penalty kick that led to the winning goal against Columbus (May 24) ... he then assisted on the game-tying goal in the 2-2 draw with D.C. (May 29), while he scored the game-winning goal against both Dallas (June 6) and Houston (June 12) ... most recently, Ralston scored the game-tying goal in the 79th minute in the 1-1 draw with New York (June 18).

TOPPING THE CHARTS

Steve Ralston owns five MLS career records, tying him with Chivas USA's Ante Razov for the most MLS career records of any player ... he is the league's career leader in minutes (30,593), games (346), starts (343), assists (124) and game-winning assists (35) ... Ralston is also second in career corner kicks (622) ... Razov owns the shots, shots on goal, offsides, game-winning goals and multi-goal games records ... known more as an assist man than a goal scorer, Ralston has also scored 65 career goals, which places him 13th on the MLS career list.

NEW ENGLAND REVOLUTION AT REAL SALT LAKE

DUBE CELEBRATES HIS BIRTHDAY WITH GAME-TYING ASSIST ...

Forward **Kheli Dube** celebrated his 25th birthday on Wednesday, June 18, by assisting on **Steve Ralston's** game-tying goal in the 79th minute of the 1-1 draw with New York ... Dube is now tied with Ralston for the team lead in both goals (4) and assists (3) ... all of Dube's goals and assists have come in the Revolution's last six games ... two of his goals have been game-winners, while another was of the game-tying variety ... one of his assists was a game-winner, while the other two have been game-tying assists.

... BUT SOME QUESTION HIS DANCING

After all four of his goals this season, **Kheli Dube** has had an unusual goal celebration, conducting a traditional Zulu dance toward the closest corner flag ... after performing the dance for the first time, he noted that it was an homage to his mother's South African roots, the Zulu tribe's homeland.

HEAPS RECORDS FIRST ASSIST SINCE 2006

Jay Heaps assisted on **Steve Ralston's** game-tying goal in the 79th minute of the 1-1 draw with New York on Wednesday night, marking his first assist since Oct. 7, 2006 ... it was the Longmeadow, Mass., native's 22nd career assist for the Revolution, placing him sixth on the club's all-time list ... the veteran defender recently became the first player in Revolution history to reach 200 appearances for the club on June 6 against Dallas, while his start against New York also bumped him into a tie for 10th place on MLS' all-time list for games played (273).

REVS' DEFENSE HOLDING FIRM

New England has conceded just 15 goals in 14 games this season (1.07 goals per game), which is the second-best defensive record in the league behind Chicago, which had conceded 0.82 goals per game heading into its Thursday-night match with Chivas USA ... however, seven of the Revolution's 15 goals against were allowed in the club's two games against Chicago (0-4 loss on April 3; 0-3 loss on May 3) ... the Revs have conceded just eight goals in the other 12 games, for a goals against average of 0.67 in those matches.

PHELAN ADDS NAME TO DEBUT LIST

Rookie **Pat Phelan** made his MLS and Revolution debut on June 12 at Houston, as the 23-year-old started alongside Jeff Larentowicz in a defensive midfield position ... Phelan was acquired by the Revs on June 4 from Toronto FC in exchange for the rights to one of New England's eight international roster spots through the 2010 season ... the graduate of Wilbraham & Monson Academy was originally drafted by Toronto in the first round (10th overall) of the 2008 MLS SuperDraft out of Wake Forest, but did not make a first team appearance for Toronto.

NEW FACES IN NEW PLACES

Nine players have made their Revolution debuts in the first 14 games of the season, while eight of those players also made their MLS debuts ... in the season opener against Houston (March 29), **Chris Albright**, **Mauricio Castro**, **Sainey Nyassi**, **Kenny Mansally** and **Kheli Dube** earned their debuts ... of the group, only Albright had seen MLS action prior to this season ... **Chase Hilgenbrinck** (April 3 at Chicago), **Amaechi Igwe** (April 9 at Kansas City), **Argenis Fernandez** (April 12 vs. Colorado) and **Pat Phelan** (June 12 at Houston) have each also made their MLS debuts.

GETTING AHEAD ...

The Revolution has been the best in MLS this season when scoring the first goal, as the club is a perfect 8-0-0 when getting on the board first ... four other teams have perfect records when scoring first this season, but none are better than 6-0-0 ... New England is 44-4-12 when scoring first since the start of the 2005 season.

... OR FALLING BEHIND

While the Revs have the best record in the league when scoring first this season, they also rank tied for second in winning percentage when allowing the first goal ... New England is 0-3-3 this season when falling behind 1-0, meaning the club has managed to earn a point in half of the games in which it has surrendered the first goal ... the Revolution's winning percentage of .250 when allowing the first goal is tied with D.C. (2-6-0) for second in the league, behind only Los Angeles (1-4-2, .286).

SCORING TO WIN

New England is an undefeated 8-0-3 in games in which it has scored at least one goal this season ... the Revs have drawn with New York twice (1-1, April 19; 1-1, June 18) and D.C. once (2-2, May 29), while they've won each of the other eight games in which they've scored ... the club has been shut out in all three of its losses.

WINNING THE TIGHT ONES

New England has been one of the best teams in the league in one-goal games this season, as the club is 4-1-0 in games decided by a single tally ... the Revs' winning percentage of .800 in one-goal games is second-best in the league ... Columbus is 5-1-0 to lead the league in the category, with its only one-goal loss coming at the hands of the Revs on May 24 ... New

England has defeated FC Dallas (1-0, April 24; 2-1, June 6), Chivas USA (2-1, May 11) and Columbus (1-0, May 24) in one-goal games, while its only blemish came against Colorado (0-1, April 12) at Gillette Stadium.

HOLDING ON TO LEADS

Since the start of the 2005 season, the Revs are 32-1-6 when leading at the half ... the club's only blemish over that time span is a 3-2 loss to the Columbus Crew on Oct. 13, 2007 at Gillette Stadium ... New England is 6-0-0 this season when taking a lead into the half.

MINUTE-MEN

Because the Revs have played more games than any other team in the league this season (14), a trio of New England players lead the league in minutes played ... **Matt Reis**, **Jay Heaps** and **Michael Parkhurst** have each played every minute of every game this season (1,260) to top the charts in the category ... all three players have also played every minute of every game (540 minutes) in the six-game, all-time series with Real Salt Lake.

MAN-GAME LOST NUMBER CONTINUES TO CLIMB

The Revs have lost 41 man-games because of injuries 14 games into the season ... **Taylor Twellman** (13), **Steve Ralston** (5), **Chris Albright** and **Wells Thompson** (4 each), **Sainey Nyassi**, **Rob Valentino**, **Gary Flood** and former Rev **Matthew Britner** (3 each), former Rev **Joe Franchino** (2) and **Jeff Larentowicz** (1) have all missed games because of injury this year.

BUSY SUMMER/FALL SEASONS COMING UP

Having qualified for both SuperLiga 2008 and the 2008-09 CONCACAF Champions Cup - and having to defend its U.S. Open Cup title - the Revolution will be playing in three in-season tournaments this year ... the additional action starts in July when both the Open Cup (July 1, July 8) and SuperLiga (July 13, July 16 and July 20) kick off ... the Revs are slated to begin play in Champions League in late August with a two-game play-in series against Joe Public FC of Trinidad & Tobago ... and the Revs still have to play regular-season MLS games ... the possibility exists that the Revs will have to play two games per week every week through the start of the MLS Playoffs (except two weeks) beginning the first full week of August.

SHAPING UP DIFFERENTLY ... AGAIN

As a result of the absence of five potential starters because of injury and international duty, New England deployed a 4-4-2 alignment in the June 12 match at Houston ... it marked the second time this season that the Revs used the formation, as they also began the April 24 match at FC Dallas with a similar setup ... New England - which has preferred to use a 3-5-2 formation since 2004 - has yet to concede a goal while in a 4-4-2 setup this season, as the club earned shutout victories on both occasions (1-0 at FC Dallas; 2-0 at Houston) ... the Revs have also set up in a 3-4-2-1 formation this season (at Chivas USA, May 11) using **Kenny Mansally** as a lone forward and **Steve Ralston** and **Mauricio Castro** as attacking midfielders.

NICOL RACING UP THE ALL-TIME WINS LIST

Head coach **Steve Nicol** picked up his 83rd career win on June 12 at Houston (2-0), and is now tied for fourth place with Thomas Rongen on MLS' career wins list ... Bob Bradley (124) and Sigi Schmid (103) occupy the top two spots, with Schmid being the only active coach besides Nicol in the top 10 ... Nicol has led the Revs to 297 points over his seven-year coaching career, which is the fourth-highest total in MLS history ... during his tenure in Foxborough - which began full-time in 2002 - Nicol has led the Revs to each of the last six Eastern Conference Championship matches (an MLS record) and four of the last six MLS Cups, including each of the last three.

TRIO OF REVS TRAIN WITH BRAZILIAN NATIONAL TEAM

Chase Hilgenbrinck, **Chris Tierney** and **Brandon Manzonelli** were given the opportunity of a lifetime on June 4, as the trio trained with the Brazilian National Team while the world's second-ranked team was preparing for its June 6 match against Venezuela at Gillette Stadium ... all three participated in passing and finishing drills, while Hilgenbrinck and Tierney played alongside each other on the backline in a scrimmage against the likes of Robinho, Pato and Adriano ... perhaps not coincidentally, all three scored in the Revolution's first reserve match after training will Brazil.

REVS TO HOST PAIR OF SUPERLIGA GAMES

The Revolution has earned one of MLS' four entries into SuperLiga 2008, joining the Houston Dynamo, D.C. United and Chivas USA in the tournament ... the Revs have been drawn into Group B with Chivas USA, Santos Laguna (MEX) and defending SuperLiga champion CF Pachuca (MEX) ... on Sunday, July 13, New England will welcome Santos to Gillette Stadium at 8 p.m. ET ... on Wednesday, July 16, the Revs will host Pachuca at 8 p.m. ET ... the Revolution will wrap up group play on Sunday, July 20, when it will take on Chivas USA in Los Angeles, Calif., at 8 p.m. ET at Cal-State Fullerton's Titan Stadium ... for the second straight year, the winner of the tournament's final on Tuesday, Aug. 5, will again receive a \$1 million dollar purse - the largest prize in North American soccer history.

NEW ENGLAND REVOLUTION AT REAL SALT LAKE

REVS TO MEET JOE PUBLIC FC IN CONCACAF CHAMPIONS LEAGUE ...

On June 11, CONCACAF unveiled the preliminary round match-ups for the 2008-09 CONCACAF Champions League, and the Revs were drawn with Joe Public FC of Trinidad & Tobago ... the two clubs will meet in a home-and-away, aggregate-goals series, with the winner advancing to the tournament's group stage ... the Revolution will travel to Trinidad & Tobago for the first leg of the series on Aug. 26, while the club will host Joe Public FC in the return leg on Sept. 2 ... Joe Public FC currently plays in the Trinidad & Tobago Professional Football League and finished as the league's runner-up in 2007 ... the club, which is one of three Caribbean qualifiers, earned its spot in the tournament by finishing as the runner-up in the 2007 Caribbean Football Union Club Championship.

... AND THE WINNER OF THE SERIES WILL JOIN GROUP C

CONCACAF announced on June 16 the complete schedule of match-ups for the group stage of the 2008-09 CONCACAF Champions League, and the winner of the Revolution-Joe Public FC series was drawn into Group C ... the group also includes Mexico's Atlante, the top Honduran seed and the winner of the Canada-Nicaragua qualifying series.

REVS TO HOST THIRD ROUND U.S. OPEN CUP GAME

U.S. Soccer announced on June 12 the third round possible pairings for the 2008 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, and the Revolution was awarded third-round hosting rights for a match to be played on July 1 ... the Revs' opponent for the match will be determined on June 24, when the Richmond Kickers and Western Mass Pioneers will play in the tournament's second round for the chance to advance and face New England ... both Richmond and Western Mass are members of USL-2, the third tier of professional soccer in the United States ... the match will mark the beginning of New England's title defense in the competition, as the club won the 2007 U.S. Open Cup ... the Revs will host the game at Veterans Stadium in New Britain, Conn.

REVS' RESERVES UPDATE

New England's reserves (1-3-2, 5 pts.) picked up their first win of the season on Wednesday night, defeating New York, 5-0, in a match that was played on the Gillette Stadium field immediately following the first-team match ... five different players scored for the Revs, including three on penalty kicks ... the reserves will return to action on Sunday, June 29, when they will host Toronto's reserves at 10 a.m.
