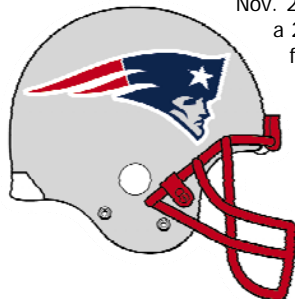
SERIES HISTORY

The Patriots and Ravens will meet for the first time in the preseason. The Houston Texans are the only other team the Patriots have yet to face in the preseason. The Patriots and Ravens have squared off four times in the regular season since the Baltimore franchise was founded following the Cleveland Browns' move to Baltimore in 1996. New England owns a perfect 4-0 record over Baltimore. The teams met week



13 of last season with the Patriots overcoming a 24-17 fourth-quarter deficit to keep their perfect regular season alive and improve to 12-0. The Ravens' first trip to Gillette Stadium came on Nov. 28, 2004 with the Patriots claiming a 24-3 victory. The teams met in the final game of the 1999 regular season, a 20-3 New England win.

The first meeting between the teams came during the Ravens' first season in Baltimore, when the Patriots prevailed 46-38 on Oct. 6, 1996. The 84 total points scored by both teams in that game rank as the second-highest total number of points in a game in Patriots history.

PATRIOTS IN THE PRESEASON

New England has won three of its last five preseason openers and has been victorious in 14 of its last 23 preseason games dating back to 2002. New England is opening the preseason at home for the first time since 2004, when they defeated Philadelphia 24-6 at Gillette Stadium. The Patriots have not lost a preseason opener at home since 1999. Since Bill Belichick became the head coach, the Patriots hold an overall mark of 20-13 (.606) in the preseason. Overall, New England is 47-45-1 at home in the preseason and is 18-29-1 in preseason openers.

The Patriots rebounded from a 24-17 fourth-quarter deficit to improve to 12-0 with a victory over the Baltimore Ravens on Monday Night Football. The game was tied at 10 at halftime and was tied at 17 entering the final quarter. Baltimore took a 24-17 lead following a 1-yard touchdown catch by Daniel Wilcox with 14:25 left in the game. The Patriots were forced to punt on their next possession, but the New England defense came up with a key turnover on a James Sanders interception at the 1-yard line to give the Patriots possession. A 42-yard return by Sanders set up a 5-play, 47-yard drive that ended in a 38-yard field goal that cut the lead to 24-20 with 8:41 left. The Patriots defense forced a three-and-out, but New England's offense was subsequently forced to punt the ball back to Baltimore. New England's defense forced yet another three-and-out, setting up a 13-play, 68-yard drive that ended in a 27-24 Patriots lead on an 8-yard scoring pass from Tom Brady to Jabar Gaffney with 44 seconds left. On the final play of the game, Baltimore completed a Hail Mary pass, but Eric Alexander brought down Baltimore's Mark Clayton at the Patriots' 3-yard line as time expired to preserve New England's comeback win. It was one of Brady's four fourth quarter comebacks in 2007.

PATRIOTS VS. RAVENS' PREDECESSORS

From 1970-83, the Patriots faced the Baltimore Colts 27 times, recording a 12-15 record in those games. The Colts moved to Indianapolis prior to the 1984 season and Baltimore was without an NFL team until the Cleveland Browns moved to Baltimore and became the Ravens in 1996. Prior to the move, the Patriots were 4-11 against the Browns, including a 2-4 record against Cleveland while Bill Belichick was the Browns' head coach from 1991-95.

QUICK HITS

- The Patriots and Ravens do not play during the regular season. The Patriots do not play any of their four 2008 preseason opponents in the 2008 regular season.
- The Patriots will open the preseason at home for just the third time since Gillette Stadium opened in 2002. The Patriots previously opened the preseason at Gillette Stadium on Aug. 7, 2003 with a 26-6 win over the New York Giants and on Aug. 13, 2003 with a 24-6 win over the Philadelphia Eagles.
- The Ravens are one of three teams the Patriots face in the preseason that have won the Super Bowl this decade. Following the Ravens (2000), the Patriots will battle the Buccaneers (2002) and close out the preseason against the Giants (2007).
- Patriots linebacker **Tedy Bruschi** scored his first career touchdown at Baltimore (10/6/96) during his rookie season when he picked up a loose ball after a blocked punt by Larry Whigham and returned it four yards for a touchdown. It was his first touchdown scored at any level of competition.



PATRIOTS VS. RAVENS

CONNECTIONS

- Patriots head coach **Bill Belichick** was raised in Annapolis, Md., approximately 30 miles from Baltimore. Belichick was also the head coach of the Cleveland Browns for the five seasons that immediately preceded the franchise's move to Baltimore (1991-95). In 1994, Belichick led the Browns to an 11-5 record, tying the second highest victory total in the franchise's 59-year history.
- Patriots Vice President of Player Personnel **Scott Pioli** was the Ravens' director of pro personnel in the team's inaugural season of 1996. Prior to that, he was with the franchise in Cleveland as the Browns' pro personnel assistant from 1992-95, where he worked with head coach **Bill Belichick**.
- Ravens general manager/executive vice president **Ozzie Newsome** was hired by **Bill Belichick** as the Cleveland Browns' special assignment scout in 1991.
- **Adalius Thomas** was originally selected by the Baltimore Ravens in the sixth round (186th overall) of the 2000 NFL Draft. He was a member of the 2000 Super Bowl squad and earned Pro Bowl honors with the Ravens in 2003 as a special teams player and 2006, when he started at linebacker.
- Patriots special assistant/secondary coach **Dom Capers** was the defensive coordinator for the Miami Dolphins when Ravens offensive coordinator **Cam Cameron** was the Dolphins head coach in 2007.
- Ravens director of pro personnel **George Kokinis** was hired by **Bill Belichick** as a college scouting assistant for the Cleveland Browns in 1991.
- Ravens cornerback **Corey Ivy** originally signed with the Patriots as a rookie free agent on May 5, 1999.
- Patriots tackle **Ryan O'Callaghan** blocked for Ravens quarterback **Kyle Boller** at California in 2002. With the help of O'Callaghan and the offensive line, Boller threw the second-most touchdown passes in school history (28) as a senior. The Ravens drafted Boller with the 19th pick of the 2003 NFL Draft via a pick obtained by a draft-day trade with the Patriots.
- Patriot **Pierre Woods** and Raven **Prescott Burgess** were members of the same linebacking corps at Michigan.
- Patriots defensive linemen **Santonio Thomas** and **Vince Wilfork** were teammates of Ravens running back **Willis McGahee** and safety **Ed Reed** at the University of Miami and were part of the 2001 BCS National Championship team.
- Patriots fullback **Kyle Eckel** attended the United States Naval Academy in Annapolis, Md.
- Ravens defensive line coach **Clarence Brooks**, a New Bedford, Mass. native, was a two-year letterman at Massachusetts, where he also held his first coaching position overseeing defensive ends. During his time at Syracuse (1980-89), Brooks was on the same staff as running backs coach **Ivan Fears** (receivers, 1980-90) and strength and conditioning coach **Mike Woicik** (strength and conditioning, 1980-89).
- Patriots strength and conditioning coach **Mike Woicik** is a native of Baltimore, Md.
- Both of Patriots tight end **Benjamin Watson's** parents were athletes at the University of Maryland. His mother, Diana, was a synchronized swimmer and his father, Ken, played linebacker.
- Ravens offensive coordinator **Cam Cameron** held the same position for the San Diego Chargers in 2002 when Patriots safety **Rodney Harrison** was on the team.
- Ravens special teams coordinator **Jerry Rosburg** was the secondary coach at Boston College from 1997-1998.
- Ravens assistant strength and conditioning coach **John Dunn** was born in Great Barrington, Massachusetts.
- Ravens assistant strength and conditioning coach **John Dunn** was the head of strength and conditioning for the San Diego Chargers while Patriots safety **Rodney Harrison** was on the team (1993-96).

- Ravens tight ends coach **Wade Harman** was a coaching assistant for the Minnesota Vikings during Patriots wide receiver **Randy Moss'** rookie season with the club in 1998.
- Ravens wide receivers coach **Jim Hostler** held the same position for the New York Jets when Patriots linebacker **Victor Hobson** and running back **LaMont Jordan** were on the team (2003-04).
- Ravens linebackers coach **Greg Mattison** was the co-defensive coordinator/defensive line coach at the University of Florida when Patriots wide receiver **Chad Jackson** was on the team (2005).
- Ravens director of college scouting **Eric DeCosta** was born in Taunton, Massachusetts and played fullback and linebacker at Taunton High School.
- Ravens assistant director of pro personnel **Vincent Newsome** was a special assignment scout for the Cleveland Browns when **Bill Belichick** was head coach (1993-95).
- Ravens area scout **Jack Glowik** held the same position for the Miami Dolphins in 2007 when Patriots special assistant/secondary coach **Dom Capers** was the defensive coordinator.
- Ravens linebacker **Jarrett Johnson** and Patriots defensive lineman **Kenny Smith** were teammates at the University of Alabama.
- Patriots offensive tackle **Wesley Britt** and Ravens fullback **Le'Ron McClain** were teammates at the University of Alabama.
- Patriots linebacker **Tedy Bruschi** and Ravens cornerback **Chris McAlister** were teammates at the University of Arizona during the 1995 season.
- Patriots cornerback **Jonathan Wilhite** and Ravens guard **Ben Grubs** were teammates at Auburn (2005-2006).
- Ravens safety **Dawan Landry** and running back **P.J. Daniels** were teammates with Patriots wide receiver **Chris Dunlap** and linebacker **Gary Guyton** at Georgia Tech.
- Ravens safety **Ronnie Prude** and Patriots linebacker **Eric Alexander** were teammates at Louisiana State and were part of the 2003 BCS National Championship team.
- Patriots cornerback **Lewis Sanders** played college football at the University of Maryland.
- Patriots linebacker **Shawn Crable** and Ravens guard **Adam Kraus** were teammates at the University of Michigan.
- Patriots running back **Laurence Maroney** and wide receiver **Ernie Wheelwright** were teammates at the University of Minnesota. The Gophers were one of the top offenses in the Big Ten as Maroney and Wheelwright set multiple school records during their time there.
- Patriots defensive linemen **Le Kevin Smith** and **Titus Adams** were teammates with Ravens punter **Sam Koch**, running back **Cory Ross** and cornerback **Fabian Washington** at the University of Nebraska.
- Patriots cornerback **Mike Richardson** and Ravens safety **Tom Zbikowski** started in the same secondary at Notre Dame.
- Ravens tackle **Mike Kracali** blocked for Patriots quarterback **Kevin O'Connell** at San Diego State (2004-06).
- Patriots receiver **Matthew Slater** and Ravens receiver **Matt Willis** were part of the same receiving corps at UCLA from 2004-2005.
- Patriots nose tackle **Steve Fifita** played for the Miami Dolphins when Ravens offensive coordinator **Cam Cameron** was the head coach (2007).
- Patriots nose tackle **Steve Fifita** and Ravens nose tackle **Kelly Talavou** started on the same defensive line at the University of Utah in 2005.



ROBERT KRAFT NEWS & NOTES

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. In 14 seasons of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what many observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.311 pct.) and recording the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won eight division titles, five conference crowns and three Super Bowl championships. The Patriots have made five Super Bowl appearances since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other NFL franchise has earned more than two Super Bowl berths.

A CHAMPIONSHIP TRADITION

The Patriots and the San Antonio Spurs are the only teams from North America's four major professional sports leagues to have won three titles since 2001. Since 1994, the Patriots trail only the New York Yankees and San Antonio Spurs in having won three titles in the period since Robert Kraft purchased the team.

SELLOUT STREAK

In the early 1990s, the Patriots seemed destined for relocation until Robert Kraft's purchase of the team rejuvenated local interest. In 1991, the season ticket base was just 17,635, barely enough to support the club. Now, the season-ticket base stands at a capped total of 61,759 and more than 50,000 fans are on a waiting list. The Patriots have sold out 149 consecutive home games (dating back to the 1994 regular-season opener).

SUCCESS STORY

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have been one of the NFL's elite franchises. Over the first 14 years of Kraft's ownership, the Patriots own the NFL's highest win total, the league's highest winning percentage and have won more Super Bowl titles, more conference championships and more playoff games than any other NFL team.

Bill Belichick is a veteran of 33 seasons as an NFL coach and is the only head coach in NFL history to win three Super Bowl titles in a four-year span. In the 2007 season, Belichick led the Patriots to the fourth undefeated and untied regular season in the NFL's 88-year history and the first since the NFL established a 16-game schedule in 1978. He has led the Patriots to the Super Bowl four times in the last seven seasons and has produced five straight AFC East titles and six division championships in the last seven seasons. Belichick's Patriots teams own the all-time NFL records for consecutive total victories (21 from 2003-04), consecutive regular-season victories (19 from 2006-07) and consecutive playoff victories (10 from 2001-05). Belichick owns the second best postseason record in NFL history (15-4) and is the winningest NFL head coach since 2001 (100-29). From 2003-04, he directed the Patriots to back-to-back Super Bowl titles while posting consecutive 17-win campaigns. Belichick has spent more seasons in the league than any other current NFL head coach, and in that time has been a part of five Super Bowl championship teams. His overall record of 105-40 with the Patriots gives him the most victories and the best winning percentage of any head coach in franchise history. Coach Belichick's overall career winning percentage of .626 (142-85-0) ranks fifth among the 18 NFL coaches with 140 or more wins. He trails only George Halas (324-151-31, .682), Don Shula (347-173-6, .666), Curly Lambeau (229-134-22, .631), and Joe Gibbs (171-101-0, .629).

ELITE COMPANY

Bill Belichick is one of nine NFL head coaches to win three or more championships since the league began postseason play in 1933. With the Patriots' victory in Super Bowl XXXIX, Belichick joined an exclusive club in which each of the eight other members has been enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

HUNDRED WIN CLUB

Bill Belichick has won 105 overall games since becoming Patriots head coach in 2000. He took 139 games to reach 100 victories with the team, the fourth fewest number of games by any coach in NFL history to reach 100 wins with a franchise. Belichick is one of three current NFL head coaches who have won 100 or more games with their current team. Belichick has recorded 91 regular-season wins and 14 playoff victories with New England.
