



PATRIOTS VS. EAGLES

SERIES HISTORY

This week's contest will mark the 18th time the Patriots and Eagles have clashed in the preseason. The Patriots own a slim 9-8 lead in the previous 17 games. The Patriots have won six consecutive preseason matches against the Eagles with five of them coming by double digits. This week's game will mark the first time the two have faced in preseason since 2004 when the Patriots opened their championship season with a decisive 24-6 victory at Gillette Stadium. The Patriots also closed the 2004 season against the Eagles when they won Super Bowl XXXIX over the Eagles on Feb. 6, 2005 by a 24-21 score. That victory was the Patriots' ninth consecutive playoff victory, which tied the Green Bay Packers (1961-67) for the longest in NFL history. The Patriots went on to break the record with their tenth consecutive playoff victory in 2005 with a win over the Jacksonville Jaguars in the first round. The two teams met last season in Week 12 of the regular season. Tom Brady led his 26th fourth-quarter comeback of his career by recording the fourth highest yardage total of his career with 380 yards while completing a season high 34 passes to help the Patriots to a 31-28 victory.

MOST FREQUENT PRESEASON OPPONENTS

The Patriots and Eagles have met 17 previous times in the preseason, making Philadelphia the Patriots' second most common preseason opponent. The only team the Patriots have played more often in the preseason is the Washington Redskins (19 times). In addition to the Eagles, the Patriots have also played the New York Giants 17 times in the preseason. The Patriots close out the 2008 preseason against the Giants next week.

The defending Super Bowl champion Patriots opened the preseason on a solid note, defeating the Philadelphia Eagles – the 2003 NFC runners-up – by a 24-6 margin. The Patriots jumped out to a 10-0 lead in the second quarter and never looked back, as another strong defensive effort at Gillette Stadium kept the Eagles from making a comeback. Super Bowl XXXVIII MVP Tom Brady opened the scoring with a 9-yard strike to David Patten with 4:10 left in the first quarter, then Adam Vinatieri capitalized on a blocked punt by Larry Izzo to make the score 10-0 on a 47-yard field goal with 12:15 left in the first half. The Eagles chipped into the lead with field goals just before halftime and then just after the intermission to put the score at 10-6 heading into the final minute of the third quarter. But, Rohan Davey found Michael Jennings for a 5-yard score with 21 seconds left in the third quarter to up the New England advantage to 17-6. On the Patriots' next possession, Davey hooked up with Ricky Bryant for a 23-yard connection and gave the Patriots a 24-6 lead. New England's defense forced the Eagles to go three-and-out on six occasions, including twice in the fourth quarter.

The Patriots rallied from a 28-24 fourth-quarter deficit to improve to 11-0 on the season with a 31-28 win over the Philadelphia Eagles. New England embarked on a 10-play, 69-yard game-winning drive that ended in Laurence Maroney's 4-yard touchdown run to give the Patriots a 31-28 lead with 7:20 remaining in the game – a lead they did not relinquish.

Wes Welker set career highs with 13 receptions for 149 yards to pace the Patriots offense, while Asante Samuel's two interceptions – one of which was returned for a touchdown and the other of which came in the end zone in the fourth quarter – led the Patriots defense. Maroney and Heath Evans added rushing touchdowns while Jabar Gaffney caught a touchdown pass from Tom Brady to round out the Patriots' scoring.

- Eagles chairman and CEO **Jeffrey Lurie** was born in Boston, Mass.
- Eagles linebacker **Dan Klecko** and Eagles cornerback **Asante Samuel** were both drafted by the Patriots in the fourth round of the 2004 draft. Klecko played for the Patriots from 2003-05 and Samuel played for New England from 2003-07.
- Patriots wide receiver **Jabar Gaffney** and his cousin, Eagles cornerback **Lito Sheppard**, were teammates at Florida. The two also attended the same high school.
- Eagles assistant secondary coach **Otis Smith** played in 56 games with 48 starts at cornerback for the Patriots in 1996 and from 2000-02. Smith also served as a coaching intern for New England in 2006.
- Patriots guard **Stephen Neal** spend three months of the 2001 season on the Eagles' practice squad before being signed to the Patriots' active roster in December, 2001. He was originally signed as a rookie free agent by New England and was waived following the 2001 training camp.
- Patriots linebacker **Pierre Woods** and Eagles wide receiver **Jason Avant** were teammates at Michigan.
- Patriots tight end **Stephen Spach** played in 13 games for the Eagles during the 2005 season.
- Eagles wide receiver **Bam Childress** was originally signed by the Patriots as a rookie free agent in 2005 and was on the active roster or practice squad with New England from 2005-07.
- Patriots defensive lineman **Le Kevin Smith** and Eagles linebacker **Stewart Bradley** were on the same Nebraska defense. Patriots guard **Russ Hochstein** and Eagles running back **Correll Buckhalter** held down the other side of the ball together four years earlier.

The Patriots won their third Super Bowl in four seasons with a 24-21

win over the Eagles in Jacksonville. Super Bowl MVP Deion Branch tied the Super Bowl record with 11 receptions, while Tom Brady compiled a 110.2 passer rating while completing 69.7 percent of his passes for two touchdowns with no interceptions. Rodney Harrison had two interceptions – including a game-clincher in the final minute – as the New England defense registered four takeaways.

The game was deadlocked 7-7 at halftime, but the Patriots got the ball to open the third quarter and drove 69 yards in nine plays to take a 14-7 lead on a 2-yard touchdown pass from Brady to Mike Vrabel. After the teams exchanged punts, the Eagles tied the game at 14 when Donovan McNabb hit Brian Westbrook for a 10-yard score. Three plays into the final quarter, the Patriots took the lead for good when Corey Dillon ran the ball in from two yards out to complete a nine-play, 66-yard drive and make the score 21-14. After a three-and-out by the Patriots defense, New England added a 22-yard field goal by Adam Vinatieri to push the lead to 24-14 with 8:40 remaining. The Eagles drove into Patriots territory on the ensuing possession, but Tedy Bruschi intercepted McNabb to halt the scoring bid. Philadelphia scored on its next possession, with a 30-yard touchdown pass from McNabb to Greg Lewis making the score 24-21 with 1:48 remaining. New England recovered the ensuing onside kick and four plays later was forced to punt, with Josh Miller's boot pinning the Eagles at their own 4-yard line with 46 seconds left. The Patriots defense held tight on Philadelphia's final chance, and Harrison's second interception of the night – with nine seconds left – clinched the win and the Patriots' third Super Bowl title.

The Patriots fell to 0-2 in the 2008 preseason with a 27-10 loss at Tampa Bay. The Buccaneers jumped out to a 17-0 lead in the second quarter before the Patriots got on the board with a 53-yard field goal as time expired in the first half. Tampa Bay extended its lead to 27-3 in the third quarter, but the Patriots found the end zone on a 1-yard touchdown run in the fourth to make the final score 27-10.

GOSTKOWSKI FROM 53

Stephen Gostkowski nailed a 53-yard field goal as time expired in the first half to improve to 4-for-4 this preseason. The 53-yarder is longer than any of Gostkowski's regular-season or playoff field goals -- his career long is 52 yards, achieved on Nov. 26, 2006 at Gillette Stadium against the Chicago Bears. In his regular-season and playoff career, Gostkowski is 2-for-2 from 50 yards or longer, hitting the 52-yarder against the Bears and nailing a 50-yard boot against the San Diego Chargers in the 2006 divisional playoffs. The last time a Patriot booted a field goal of 53 yards or longer in the regular season or playoffs was on Nov. 10, 2002, when Adam Vinatieri nailed a franchise-record 57-yarder against Chicago in Champaign, Ill. If Gostkowski's 53-yard field goal had happened in the regular season, it would have tied the fifth-longest field goal in team history.

LYNCH DEBUTS

Veteran safety John Lynch made his Patriots debut, seeing his first action six minutes into the game on a third-and-two play. Lynch, who signed with New England as a free agent on Friday, Aug. 15, spent the first 11 years of his career with Tampa Bay (1993-2003), and was a leader on the Buccaneers' Super Bowl XXXVII championship squad in the 2002 season.

EVANS IN THE ZONE

Heath Evans put the Patriots into the end zone for the first time on the night with a 1-yard touchdown run with 10:20 remaining in the game. The touchdown was Evans' first of the preseason. Last season, Evans set a career high with three touchdowns (all rushing). He has four career touchdowns in his seven seasons in the NFL.

QUICK HITS

- In addition to John Lynch, six Patriots saw their first action of the preseason. CB Ellis Hobbs, RB Sammy Morris, LB Mike Vrabel, OL John Welbourn, WR Randy Moss and WR Wes Welker all played against the Buccaneers after not playing in the preseason opener against the Baltimore Ravens on Aug. 7.
- The Patriots trailed by 24 points in the third quarter, falling behind by a 27-3 score. The last time the Patriots trailed by 24 or more points in a game was on Oct. 10, 2005, when they trailed the Denver Broncos 28-3 in the third quarter of an eventual 28-20 loss at Gillette Stadium. Last season, the biggest deficit the Patriots faced was 10 points, trailing 20-10 in the fourth quarter of an eventual 24-20 win at Indianapolis on Nov. 4, 2007.
- Rookie linebacker Shawn Crable recorded a sack of Chris Simms and a forced fumble on the same play on third-and-six on the final play of the third quarter, forcing a Tampa Bay punt that set up a Patriots touchdown drive. Last week against Baltimore, Crable shared a sack, had two quarterback hits and recorded an interception.

The Patriots opened the 2008 preseason with a narrow 16-15 loss to the Baltimore Ravens at Gillette Stadium. LaMont Jordan's 1-yard touchdown run with 6:07 remaining in the game cut a 16-9 Patriots deficit to just one point, but a failed two-point conversion sealed the Patriots' fate as the Ravens escaped with the win.

Baltimore recorded the game's first two scores, jumping out to a 10-0 second-quarter lead. The Patriots got on the board with a 36-yard field goal, but the Ravens answered to take a 13-3 lead heading into halftime.

The Ravens extended their advantage to 16-3 with a field goal to finish their first possession of the second half, but the Patriots then buckled down and did not allow any more Baltimore points for the rest of the game. New England began its final charge with a 44-yard field goal that cut the Baltimore lead to 16-6 entering the final quarter, and later narrowed the deficit to 16-9. Pierre Woods came up with the play of the night for the Patriots when he sacked Baltimore's Joe Flacco, forcing a fumble on the play and then recovered the fumble to give the Patriots possession on the Ravens' 31-yard line. New England promptly drove in for LaMont Jordan's touchdown run, but on the two-point conversion attempt, Kevin O'Connell's pass was deflected, leaving the final score 16-15.

TOUCHDOWN FOR JORDAN

LaMont Jordan scored on a 1-yard scoring run in the fourth quarter to cut the Ravens' lead to 16-15. Jordan, who was signed by the Patriots as a free agent on July 26, has scored 24 rushing touchdowns in his seven-year career with the New York Jets (2001-04) and Oakland Raiders (2005-07).

CRABLE INTERCEPTION

Patriots rookie linebacker Shawn Crable intercepted a Kyle Boller pass and returned it 11 yards to the Ravens' 41-yard line in the second quarter. The play set up a 36-yard field goal by Stephen Gostkowski that cut the Baltimore lead to 10-3. Crable did not have an interception in his collegiate career, playing in 47 games with 20 starts for Michigan from 2004-07. His last interception in a game came as a senior at Washington High School in Massillon, Ohio.

WOODS STRIP-SACK

Pierre Woods sacked Baltimore quarterback Joe Flacco, caused him to fumble on the play and then recovered the loose ball himself to give the Patriots possession at the Ravens' 31-yard line in the fourth quarter. The play set up a 31-yard scoring drive that ended in a 1-yard touchdown run by LaMont Jordan to cut Baltimore's lead to 16-15. Last season, Woods led the Patriots with 22 special teams tackles and has recorded 33 special teams tackles in 24 career games since being signed by the Patriots as an undrafted rookie free agent prior to the 2006 season.

THOMAS STRIP-SACK

Adalius Thomas strip-sacked Kyle Boller in the first quarter and Ty Warren recovered the loose ball to give the Patriots possession at the Ravens' 44-yard line. Thomas, who played seven seasons for Baltimore from 2000-06, had 6.5 sacks in his first season with the Patriots in 2007, including six sacks in his final seven regular-season games. Thomas added a pair of sacks in Super Bowl XLII. Over his eight-year NFL career, Thomas has totaled 45.0 sacks and 17 forced fumbles.



ROBERT KRAFT NEWS & NOTES

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. In 14 seasons of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what many observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.311 pct.) and recording the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won eight division titles, five conference crowns and three Super Bowl championships. The Patriots have made five Super Bowl appearances since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other NFL franchise has earned more than two Super Bowl berths.

Since 1994, the Patriots trail only the New York Yankees and San Antonio Spurs in having won three titles in the period since Robert Kraft purchased the team.

SELLOUT STREAK

In the early 1990s, the Patriots seemed destined for relocation until Robert Kraft's purchase of the team rejuvenated local interest. In 1991, the season ticket base was just 17,635, barely enough to support the club. Now, the season-ticket base stands at a capped total of 61,759 and more than 50,000 fans are on a waiting list. The Patriots have sold out 149 consecutive home games (dating back to the 1994 regular-season opener).

SUCCESS STORY

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have been one of the NFL's elite franchises. Over the first 14 years of Kraft's ownership, the Patriots own the NFL's highest win total, the league's highest winning percentage and have won more Super Bowl titles, more conference championships and more playoff games than any other NFL team.

Bill Belichick is the only head coach in NFL history to win three Super Bowl titles in a four-year span. In the 2007 season, Belichick led the Patriots to the fourth undefeated and untied regular season in the NFL's 88-year history and the first since the NFL established a 16-game schedule in 1978. He has led the Patriots to the Super Bowl four times in the last seven seasons and has produced five straight AFC East titles and six division championships in the last seven seasons. Belichick's Patriots teams own the all-time NFL records for consecutive total victories (21 from 2003-04), consecutive regular-season victories (19 from 2006-07) and consecutive playoff victories (10 from 2001-05). Belichick owns the second best postseason record in NFL history (15-4) and is the winningest NFL head coach since 2001 (100-29). From 2003-04, he directed the Patriots to back-to-back Super Bowl titles while posting consecutive 17-win campaigns. Belichick has spent more seasons in the league than any other current NFL head coach, and in that time has been a part of five Super Bowl championship teams. His overall record of 105-40 with the Patriots gives him the most victories and the best winning percentage of any head coach in franchise history. Coach Belichick's overall career winning percentage of .626 (142-85-0) ranks fifth among the 18 NFL coaches with 140 or more wins. He trails only George Halas (324-151-31, .682), Don Shula (347-173-6, .666), Curly Lambeau (229-134-22, .631), and Joe Gibbs (171-101-0, .629).

ELITE COMPANY

Bill Belichick is one of nine NFL head coaches to win three or more championships since the league began postseason play in 1933. With the Patriots' victory in Super Bowl XXXIX, Belichick joined an exclusive club in which each of the eight other members has been enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame.
