GENERAL INFORMATION & POLICIES

The New England Revolution is pleased to assist you in your coverage of the team. As an organization, Kraft Sports Group - the New England Patriots and New England Revolution - has specific media policies of which you should be aware as you prepare to cover the team.

GENERAL MEDIA

Training sessions throughout the season are open to the media. In your coverage of daily sessions, we ask for your cooperation in observing the following practice policies:

Please do not report on match strategy. This includes describing specific formations, personnel groupings, set pieces and combinations.

Please do not quote, paraphrase or report the comments made by coaches, staff or players during a training session.

GENERAL SECURITY POLICIES

Because of security procedures in place at Gillette Stadium, any member of the media is wishes to attend a training session at the stadium's practice fields or on the main field, must inform the Revolution Communications staff before the close of business the day before you wish to come. We cannot guarantee admittance to the stadium grounds if we are not aware that you are planning to come down.

CHECKING IN AT GILLETTE STADIUM

All members of the media who attend any Revolution training session at Gillette Stadium must check in at Security Command, located at the south end of the stadium (through the doors under the red awning). All members of the media who have RSVPd with the Revs Communications staff will be on a list at the check-in window. Please have proper forms of ID available.

PHOTO AND PRESS CREDENTIAL WILL CALL

Press Will Call is located at the south end of the stadium at Security Command (through the doors under the red awning). This is for press and photo credentials only. All game tickets are to be left at the ticket office in the north end zone (Bank of America Gale).

PARKING FOR TRAINING

To enter the stadium, please use the P1 Gate and stop at the security booth at the entrance to Gillette Stadium. You will be directed to the proper parking lot from there.

STILL PHOTOGRAPHERS

Still photographers will be allowed to shoot each practice in its entirety. In general, please remain off the playing field and along the outside markings of the field. If you are in need of a specific shot or angle that is not included in this area, please see a member of the Communications staff for assistance.

There will be times during practice that the team will practice set pieces, corner kicks and specific team formations. The team requests that these portions of training not be photographed and not be reported on. Thank you in advance for your understanding and cooperation.

TV PHOTOGRAPHERS

TV cameras will be allowed to shoot training in its entirety, however, there will be instances - such as set pieces and corner kicks - where a member of the Revolution Communications staff will ask all TV photographers to stop shootling for a brief time period.

PLAYER AND STAFF INTERVIEWS

All player and staff interviews will be conducted on the practice fields at the conclusion of the training session. All interview requests will be collected by members of the Communications staff during the training session. Generally, head coach Steve Nicol will be available first, followed by the players after they have completed their cool down.

Any interview requests that will require additional time with a player or coach should be made well in advance so that we can make the appropriate arrangements. Please contact a member of the Revolution Communications staff to facilitate all interview requests.

FILING AT THE STADIUM

If you need to work and file from Gillette Stadium on a non-gameday, please inform a member of the Communications staff in advance of your arrival so the appropriate arrangements can be made. We cannot guarantee available space if we do not know ahead of time.

GILLETTE STADIUM DIRECTIONS

FROM BOSTON'S LOGAN AIRPORT TO GILLETTE STADIUM

When exiting the airport, follow signs to the Ted Williams Tunnel (I-90 West). Take I-90 West to exit 24 (I-93). Follow signs to I-93 South. Follow I-93 South and it turns into Route 128 North (right two lanes). Take Exit 1 to I-95 South (Providence). Follow I-95 for 7.2 miles to Exit 9 (Wrentham). Follow Route 1 South approximately three miles. Enter Gate P1. Approximate driving time: 40 minutes.

FROM PROVIDENCE'S T.F. GREEN AIRPORT TO STADIUM

Follow signs to I-95 North (Providence). Follow I-95 North for 26 miles to I-495 North (exit 6B). Take the first exit (2.6 miles) onto Route 1 North at exit 14A. Follow Route 1 North for 4.4 miles. Enter Gate P1. Approximate driving time: 30 minutes.

FROM SHERATON BRAINTREE (VISITING TEAM HOTEL)

Exit hotel driveway and take a left and follow signs to I-93 South. Follow I-93 South as it turns into Rt. 128 North (right two lanes), and take Exit 1 to I-95 South (Providence). Follow I-95 for 7.2 miles to Exit 9 (Wrentham). Follow Route 1 South approximately three miles. Enter Gate P1. Approximate driving time: 25 minutes.

DIRECTIONS INSIDE GILLETTE STADIUM

FROM PRESS BOX TO LOCKER ROOMS AND INTERVIEW AREA Take press elevator to Level F (Field Level). Exit to the right and follow

lake press elevator to Level + (Field Level). Exit to the right and follow the green painted line headed north on the service-level concourse. That will lead you to the post game interview area (on the right after the broadcast compound) and the visitor's locker room (past the interview area and Kraft Sports Productions), which are located on the right-hand side. The Revolution locker room is located beyond the visiting locker room on the left side of the tunnel, past the field tunnel entrance.

FROM PRESS BOX TO STADIUM EXIT

Take press elevator to Level F (Field Level). Exit is immediately to your left of the elevator. The media parting lot is to your left when exiting the stadium.

TELEVISION AND RADIO PACKAGES

REVOLUTION TV

n February 2007, the Revolution announced that the team entered a two-year, exclusive television rights agreement that makes TV38 (WSBK-TV) the team's only regional television broadcast partner in the Boston market.

The deal continues the Revolution's proud tradition of having every MLS match televised over the course of the club's 12-season history.

"This is a great step for the Revolution and our fans," Revolution Chief Operating Officer Brian Bilelio said. "In TV38, the Revs are pleased to have a partner that is fully committed to promoting our club in the marketplace, which is great for the fans, the team and the television station. We've witnessed tremendous growth in the value of MLS soccer television on a national level, and now the Revs-TV38 partnership is a reflection of that here in New England."

"TV38 and New England Revolution soccer is an ideal partnership," said Ed Piette, President and General Manager of Boston's TV38, WBZ-TV, and Providence's CW28 (WLWC-TV). "TV38 is well-known as the region's legacy, independent station broadcasting some of the best, local sports programming. Not only will the Revs be a great addition to our rich program line-up, but also as their broadcast partner, TV38 will be able to bring games to viewers who otherwise might not be able to see them. This is a tremendous opportunity for both TV38 and the Revolution to grow in popularity across New England."

In addition to the Revs' matches on TV38, a selection of Revs games televised on national broadcast partners ABC/ESPN2, Fox Soccer Channel and HDNet. Additionally, league Spanish language broadcast partner Univision (which also includes the Galavision and Telefutura networks) will broadcast Revolution matches in Spanish to complement the full slate of games shown in English.

This season, Kraft Sports Productions will again produce every regionally televised Revolution match. KSP is headed by Executive Producer Matt Smith and Senior Coordinating Producer Dave Mondillo. For the fourth straight season, Jim Daddona is the producer for Revs regional telecasts. Revs broadcasts in 2007 will again be enhanced by an innovative, cutting-edge replay feature that allows fans to have multiple looks at important plays without missing live action.









REVOLUTION ENGLISH RADIO

The Revolution is also committed to the best in live game radio coverage. Again this season Boston's Sportsradio 850 WEEI AM, the 50,000-watt market leader, will be the primary carrier for Revs radio along with WEEI 103.7 FM in Providence, WVEI-FM WVEI 105.5 FM in Springfield and WVEI 1440 AM in Worcester. Conflicting games will be broadcast on WEEI's sister station, WRKO 680 AM. All WEEI and WRKO games can also be heard streaming live on www.revolutionsoccrer net

All 30 Revolution regular season games will again be broadcast on radio and on the web. Revolution Director of Broadcast Production Gary Grodecki heads Revolution radio and webcasting production, including the weekly talk show, "In the Net" on revolutionsoccer.net.

ANNOUNCERS

Veteran announcer **Brad Feldman** is now in his seventh season with the Revolution, having called over two hundred matches involving the club. This season marks his third as the primary play-by-play announcer for the team's telecasts.

Feldman's resume includes play-by-play commentary for Italian Serie A telecasts on ESPN International as well as other many other top competitions, including the UEFA Champions League and the Scotlish Premier League. He has also announced broadcasts of soccer matches at every level of the sport in the U.S., including USL, WUSA and Super-Y matches. Feldman began his MLS broadcasting career as a sideline reporter on Kansas City Wizards telecasts in 1999.

Color Analyst Greg Lalas returns for his third full season in the booth. In addition to his broadcasting work, Lalas works as the U.S. editor for Goal.com and is a soccer columnist for Sl.com. A writer and editor based in Brooklyn, N.Y., the former Revolution defender is a regular contributor to several publications, including Boston Magazine.

A 1994 graduate of Brown University, Lalas captained the Bears team in 1992 and 1993, earning all-luy honors his senior season. He played for the Tampa Bay Mutiny in 1996 and the Revolution in 1997.


