KRAFT FAMILY TO AWARD \$25K IN SCHOLARSHIPS TO GRADUATING HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS

The Kraft family is pleased to announce a new scholarship program for Foxborough residents who are graduating high school seniors. The new scholarship will significantly increase the amount of funds available to students each year through five, \$5,000 scholarships.

For years, the Kraft family and the New England Patriots Charitable Foundation have awarded up to \$2,000 in scholarships annually to graduating high school seniors in Foxborough. Last year, Robert Kraft was so impressed with graduating Foxborough High School senior Angela VandenBoom that he and his family chose to award her with a scholarship to cover her tuition and fees for one, full year at UMass Boston (valued at \$13,435).

As Robert and Jonathan Kraft began reviewing the scholarship program for the 2017-2018 school year, they felt strongly that the organization's scholarship should make a

DANA-FARBER TO DEVELOP OUTPATIENT HOSPITAL SATELLITE AT PATRIOT PLACE

Dana-Farber Cancer Institute recently finalized an agreement to lease approximately 34,000 square feet of medical office space at Patriot Place to develop a Dana-Farber medical oncology and hematology outpatient hospital satellite facility.

Dana-Farber will provide adult medical oncology and hematology services, such as exams, infusions, support services (e.g. nutrition and social work) and select clinical trials in this space.

"We are continually seeking ways to provide cancer patients with access to Dana-Farber's world-class physicians and medical professionals closer to their homes. We are thrilled to be developing a site at Patriot Place," said Craig A. Bunnell, MD, MPH, MBA, Chief Medical Officer, Dana-Farber.

The Dana-Farber outpatient hospital satellite at Patriot Place is expected to open to patients in the spring of 2020. When fully operational, approximately 40 new employment opportunities will be created to care for patients and operate the facility.

"The addition of Dana-Farber to the expansive medical campus at Patriot Place is just another example of the high-quality medical services that are now reaching this region," said Foxborough Town Manager Bill Keegan. "Foxborough is excited to welcome Dana-Farber to our growing collection of world-class medical facilities within our community."

"The addition of these medical services builds upon the world-renowned medical care provided at Patriot Place and furthers our commitment to providing local communities access to world-class health care closer to home. We are thrilled to welcome Dana-Farber and the best oncology services to Foxborough."

Partners in Patriotism Fund approaching \$350K in donations

The Partners in Patriotism Fund (PIP Fund) awarded 36 grants totaling more than \$98,000 in 2017 to Foxborough-based organizations, programs, events and residents in need. Through the first business quarter of 2018, the PIP Fund's charitable contributions to Foxborough have exceeded \$340,000.

Since its inception in 2014, the PIP Fund has donated nearly \$240,000 to community projects, charitable endeavors, programs and organizations. An additional \$100,000 has been given to Foxborough residents who have fallen on hard times and are in need of financial assistance.

"The partnership between our organization and the Foxborough community through the 13 residents who volunteer their time to sit on our Grants Committee and vet the applications we receive has been

wonderful to watch evolve over the years," said Kraft Group Chairman and CEO Robert Kraft. "We care very deeply about giving back to the community and being good neighbors. It's been very rewarding to see the type of positive and lasting impact the PIP Fund has been able to make in Foxborough."

In 2017, the impact of the PIP Fund was seen most in the Town's athletic programs (\$28,000) and schools (\$23,000). Among the highlights:

- \$9,675 donated to the Foxboro Touchdown Club in support of renaming the football field at Ahern Middle School, "Jack Martinelli Field"
- \$5,500 donated to the Foxborough High School

Patriots celebrate Read Across America Week with special appearance at Taylor Elementary School

The sign outside the Charles Taylor Elementary School in Foxborough on March 2 displayed the message, "Make today awesome." Principal Dr. Moira Rodgers made sure to do just that for her students with some help from the New England Patriots Foundation.

In celebration of National Read Across America Day and Dr. Seuss' birthday, the Patriots made a special appearance at the elementary school just down the road from Gillette Stadium to promote the importance of reading.

Patriots defensive back and 2017 team captain Duron Harmon and Patriots Cheerleader Michaela Main were the surprise guests; reading to about 200 students and talking about their own experiences in school and why reading is important to them.

"At the end of the day, you can't do anything without reading," Harmon said. "Reading is very, very important. The jobs that these kids will have when they get older; they will have to read at a high level. The more you can read, the more you can understand and the more you can prepare for this world."

Harmon read the children's books, "Only One You" by Linda

Kranz and "Let's Go, Patriots!" by Aimee Aryal. The two-time Super Bowl champion especially enjoyed the enthusiasm he received from the young members of Patriots Nation.

"When you have elementary school children at 8 o'clock in the morning yelling, 'Let's go, Patriots' at the top of their lungs, that's amazing and just lets you know the support that we have in the Foxborough community," Harmon said. "It's a community that loves the Patriots and us as players love that about Foxborough."

Main kicked the event off by reading Patriots wide receiver Malcolm Mitchell's children's book, "The Magician's Hat."

Following the reading and a question and answer period, Harmon encouraged the students to continue their reading by joining the Patriots Foundation and The Hall at Patriot Place presented by Raytheon's literacy program, "Read Between the Lines," which begins in July.

"We hope you had a blast with us this morning and continue to read," Harmon said.

At the conclusion of the event, every student received a Patriots team photo and pins.

"Today was truly an awesome day," Principal Rodgers said.

Longtime Foxborough resident Mark Conroy has been a Patriots Season Ticket Member for as long as Robert Kraft has owned the team (24 years), but has never had the opportunity to attend any of the team's previous nine Super Bowl appearances.

The 10th time turned out to be the charm for Conroy, as he was selected in the Patriots first ever Foxborough Season Ticket Member Super Bowl ticket lottery, which provided him access to purchase two tickets to Super Bowl LII.

Conroy was skeptical of the news at first, but excitedly jumped at the chance to see the Patriots take on the Philadelphia Eagles at U.S. Bank Stadium in Minneapolis, Minn.

"I was shocked," Conroy said. "I just couldn't believe it when I got the call."

Conroy took his wife, Bernadette, with him to the Big Game, calling it a "once-in-a-lifetime experience."

"Having my wife with me on this trip was very special," Mark said. "Visiting a new city and meeting people from all over was a nice experience. The Minnesota people were very friendly."

And while the outcome of the game was not what the Conroys or Patriots Nation had hoped for, the couple still found the experience to be enjoyable.

"At first, being at the Super Bowl felt surreal," Mark said. "But then it became like another football game. We loved it!"

The Patriots held a Super Bowl ticket lottery exclusively for Foxborough residents after receiving feedback from residents who attended a Foxborough Season Ticket Member Forum at Gillette Stadium in January. One of the guests suggested that the organization should hold a Super Bowl ticket lottery exclusively for residents who are Patriots Season Ticket Members when the Patriots are in the Super Bowl. The organization listened to the suggestion and obliged a few weeks later after the Patriots defeated the Jaguars in the AFC Championship Game in Foxborough.

"We would like to thank the Krafts and the Patriots for the experience of going to a Super Bowl," Mark said. "My wife and I had a great time."

'I Need My Life Back'

Resident battling Bipolar Disorder receives support from PIP Fund for a service dog

Foxborough resident Emma Carroll, 25, has been battling anxiety and depression for as long as she can remember, but wasn't diagnosed with these disorders until 2010, when she was a freshman in college.

"I was put on countless amounts of medications to try to manage the symptoms," Carroll said. "At first, the medications would seem like they were working, but eventually they all would stop."

Since her initial diagnosis, Carroll has seen multiple doctors and has been diagnosed with anxiety, social anxiety, depression, an eating disorder, panic attacks, PTSD and Bipolar II Disorder. It was the bipolar disorder that proved to be the most dangerous.

"My Bipolar II Disorder includes depressive episodes and hypomania, which basically means I feel on top of the world and like I can accomplish anything," Carroll said. "Sometimes the depression and hypomania come in what's called a mixed episode (both happen at once). It was during one of these mixed episodes that I attempted suicide."

Carroll says she is thankful to be alive today, but the traumatic incident is something she carries with her every day.


"Every day is a new struggle for me," she said. "There are some days that I can't even force myself to get out of bed, shower or eat. Over the past few years, these disorders have gotten significantly worse to the point where I don't follow through with plans; I barely see my friends and I don't spend time with my family."

These disorders have also inhibited Carroll's ability to go to work or attend school.

"Since I was 16, I have always had a job," Carroll said. "But after an injury in 2016, I couldn't return to work and because of these illnesses, I haven't been able to look for work. I have also had to take a leave of absence from school."

Carroll has tried countless combinations of medications prescribed by her doctor, but hasn't found any viable solutions.

"I don't want to have to rely on them to live a normal life," she said. "The bottom line is I need my life back."

To overcome her struggles, Carroll has turned to Golden Opportunities for Independence (GOFI), a 501(c)3 non-profit organization that trains and pairs highly-trained service dogs with people living with disabilities as a means to facilitate confident and independent lifestyles. The Partners in Patriotism Fund proudly supported Carroll's dream of receiving a service dog to help her overcome her anxiety disorders by donating \$2,500 in Carroll's name to GOFI.

"I have been lucky enough to be matched with Aurora, a calm and loving dog who has already made a huge difference in my life," Carroll said.

A GoFundMe page has been started to help Carroll raise the \$35,000 needed to pay for the breeding and extensive training of her dog. Donations can be made to support Carroll by visiting www.gofundme.com/Emma_GOFI.

"We feel this program is important to the special needs community and are very excited to be able to host these events in Foxborough," said Cathy Hickey, the grant applicant.



The New England Revolution have returned to the pitch for the 2018 MLS regular season with a new look. New head coach Brad Friedel and a trio of international signings in Cristian Penilla, Gabriel Somi, and Wilfried Zahibo are cause for excitement as the Revs look to return to the MLS Cup Playoffs in 2018.

After a legendary, two-decade career as a Premier League and U.S. Men's National Team goalkeeper, Friedel has taken over as the Revs' head coach after

time as head coach of the United States U-19 National Team, an assistant on various other U.S. Youth National Teams and an assistant at all levels of Tottenham Hotspur's Academy.

Penilla, a native of Ecuador, joins the Revolution for 2018 on loan from Mexican club Pachuca. The attacker has significant experience, having made more than 200 appearances and logging over 12,000 minutes in his eight-year professional career.

Somi, a Swedish left back

comes to the Revs after six professional seasons in Sweden. In 132 combined senior appearances in Sweden's top two divisions, Somi registered six goals and 12 assists.

Zahibo, a towering French midfielder who stands at 6-foot-2, joins the squad following seven professional seasons in France and Spain.

Fans can watch Friedel, Penilla, Somi and Zahibo as well as the rest of the club at Gillette Stadium this season.
