SIGNS OF FALL

Arrival of autumn means return of Patriots football

It's fall in Foxborough and there's a fresh chill in the air as we welcome the season's main attraction - Patriots football.

Foxborough has been home to a winning football tradition since Robert Kraft purchased the New England Patriots in 1994, but that tradition was born of humble beginnings. In the five seasons prior to Kraft's purchase of the club, the Patriots won just 19 of 80 games - the worst record in the NFL over that span. In the 20 seasons since Kraft's purchase, no NFL team has won more games, more division titles (13), more conference titles (6) or more Super Bowl championships (3) than the Patriots. Additionally, the team and its fans have established a bond mostly unseen between 1960 and 1993. That bond is why every home game during the Kraft era has been sold out and why there is a lengthy waiting list for season tickets.

The 2014 campaign marks the 20th anniversary of ownership for the Kraft family and as of Oct. 20, the team is 5-2 and in first place of the AFC East with some great games coming up. We are thrilled to get back to football in Foxborough.

Speaking of football, we welcomed UMass back to Gillette Stadium for games against Boston College, Colorado and Eastern Michigan. In December, we will welcome 12 high school football teams from Massachusetts to compete

for six MIAA state championships. It will be the eighth consecutive year Gillette Stadium hosts the games, and we are proud to provide these teams an NFL-caliber game presentation and a memorable experience for these communities.

On the pitch, the Revolution hosted the Foxborough and Mansfield high school soccer teams for an exciting doubleheader in September (more on page 5). The Revs, which welcomed U.S. World Cup star Jermaine Jones to the family in August, qualified for the MLS playoffs for the second consecutive season!

Elsewhere around Gillette Stadium, we completed our new football operations facility on the east side of the stadium and added new LED signage throughout the venue.

At Patriot Place, we celebrated the highly anticipated opening of Splitsville Luxury Lanes and will be opening Muse Paintbar later this fall.

As we begin the fourth quarter, we are now accepting donation request applications (found on page 9) for our Partners in Patriotism Fund, as we provide a community resource dedicated to supporting Foxborough-based causes and philanthropic efforts. We will also be hosting several annual events that have become staples to our calendar year at Patriot Place, including the opening of Winter Skate and the Holiday Tree Lighting (details on page 6).

Pats Honor Breast Cancer Survivors

Prior to the Oct. 5 victory over the Cincinnati Bengals on NBC's "Sunday Night Football," the Kraft family and New England Patriots honored more than 160 breast cancer survivors along with their caregivers during a touching pregame ceremony at Gillette Stadium to kick off Breast Cancer Awareness Month and the NFL's "A Crucial Catch" campaign.

The survivors and caregivers wore pink t-shirts and formed a large breast cancer awareness ribbon at midfield during team introductions and the national anthem. Among those on the field during the ceremony was Foxborough resident and breast cancer survivor, Patty Noonan.

"This was absolutely an awesome experience and a very special moment for me and the other survivors," said Noonan, 53. "It gets you teary-eyed, but having the crowd cheering us on out there was truly amazing and makes you feel better."

Noonan, a lifelong Foxborough resident, was diagnosed with breast cancer when she was 37 years old. Through the help and support of her friends and family, Noonan has been

Patriots help Igo School celebrate opening of community playground

The smiles and cheers of nearly 400 kindergarten students greeted Patriots Chairman and CEO Robert Kraft as he joined Foxborough officials on Sept. 30 to celebrate the grand opening and dedication of a new community playground at Igo Elementary School.

"Coming here and seeing your smiling faces and your great cheers reminds me of what's important," Kraft told the children, less than 24 hours after the Patriots Week 4 loss to the Kansas City Chiefs. "This is our hometown and we really love being a part of it. I hope you enjoy your playground very much."

The Sept. 30 visit came 126 days after Kraft and the Patriots surprised school officials with a \$60,000 grant for the playground in May, doubling the amount that was expected.

"We doubled the NFL PLAY 60 grant, but really, the event was for you young folks to exercise at least 60 minutes a day," Kraft said. "You are lucky to be

in this great town with the leadership of all the great people that work in the school district."

The event featured an assembly, where Igo students shared what they enjoy about their new playground and a ribbon-cutting ceremony, where Kraft and Danny Nickerson, the 6-year-old from Foxborough who has received hundreds of thousands of cards from around the world as he battles an inoperable brain tumor, officially opened the playground. The event included appearances by Patriots and Pro Football Hall of Famer Andre Tippett, Patriots cheerleaders and team mascot, Pat Patriot, who sent students into a frenzy upon his arrival.

Igo School Principal Michael Stanton described the playground as "one of a kind" and thanked Mr. Kraft and the Patriots for their generosity.

"There's no other playground like this in the entire world," Stanton said. "We have been

"I thought the atmosphere really created a fun and exciting

experience for both the teams and the fans," Nash said. "A lot of great players play professionally at Gillette and for us to be on the same field as them was something I think the players will take away forever."

The New England Revolution, working with booster clubs of both schools, hosted the matches. The Foxborough varsity girls played to a 2-2 draw vs. Mansfield while the varsity boys defeated the Hornets, 4-1, under the stadium lights.





Pats Camp Draws Record Crowds to Foxborough

Anticipation for the 2014 New England Patriots season reached a fever pitch in July and August as tens of thousands of fans flocked to Foxborough to attend the team's training camp on the practice fields behind Gillette Stadium.

Through the first weekend of training camp, nearly 46,000 fans came to town to get an early glimpse at the 2014 squad. Some traveled from as far away as California and Utah, while others, like Foxborough's John Doyle, made the short trip down Route 1 to catch the action.

"It doesn't get better than this,"



Doyle said. "This has become a summer tradition for me and I look forward to this every year. All of New England waits for this day. We love our Patriots."

The strong training camp

crowds continued throughout the summer, including a single-practice attendance record of 25,317 on Tuesday, Aug. 12, as fans lined the stadium's ramps to watch the Patriots practice with

Earlier in the month, nearly 23,000 fans attended the team's annual in-stadium practice for season ticket members and Foxborough residents under the Gillette Stadium lights on Aug. 1.



The children, ages 8-13, watched excitedly from the front row of the Foundation's VIP tent as players participated in various drills throughout the afternoon session.


One of the campers, Abigail Danitschek, 10, was excited to attend her first training camp practice and see Patriots tight end Rob Gronkowski.
